# 2024 Words, Numbers & Thoughts...

The year 2024 was a record-breaking year for the aviation industry worldwide, with global passenger traffic fully recovering from the pandemic's impact and surpassing 2019 levels, albeit with varying pace and trends across different regions and markets. In a global landscape shaped by evolving travel demand, economic shifts, and geopolitical and operational challenges, AIA achieved an all-time high in traffic performance, surpassing pre-Covid traffic levels by 25%, clearly outpacing European airport trends. This achievement reflects the increased demand for Athens and its attractiveness as a prime leisure and business destination, the resilience of air travel amid global and industry challenges and consumers' prioritisation of experiential spending.

2024 was also a milestone year for the Company, marked by its successful listing on the Athens Exchange on February 7, 2024. In addition, in light of the strong traffic trends, the Company is further accelerating its Airport Expansion Programme, with the ultimate objective of reaching a capacity to serve 40 million passengers annually by 2032. AIA also remains at the forefront of sustainability, maintaining its commitment to achieving Net Zero emissions by the end of 2025 – significantly ahead of industry's set targets.

The Aerostat Handbook 2024, one of AlA's corporate publications now in its 23rd edition, aspires to serve as a comprehensive guide detailing the Airport's traffic evolution throughout the year. Offering valuable insights and information to our customers, business partners, and investors and focusing on key market trends and characteristics, it aims at providing in-depth analysis of major traffic segments, operational processes, passenger profiles, incoming and outgoing tourism traffic, as well as broader market trends in Greece and worldwide.

With change being the only constant in this BANI (Brittle, Anxious/Ambiguous, Non-Linear, Incomprehensible) world, we hope that the information and the data contained herein will prove to be valuable, providing adequate clarity to the characteristics of the Greek and International aviation market.

CHAPTER - 1

# Catching up with 2024

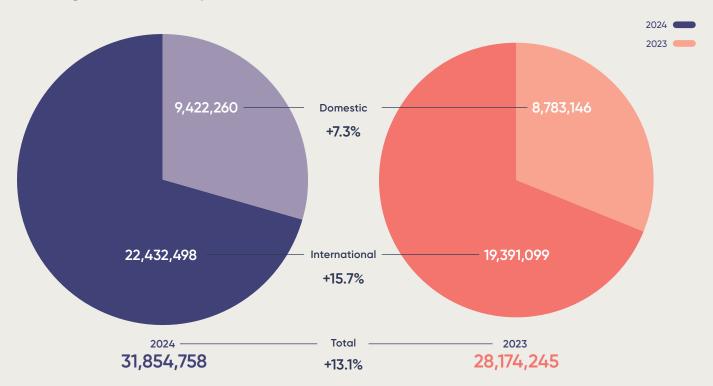
2024 was a record year for Athens International Airport, as it remained among the fastest-growing major airports in Europe In 2024, the Greek economy maintained its upward momentum despite global uncertainties, with tourism continuing to serve as a key driver of investment and growth. In addition to navigating external challenges, Greece also faced domestic pressures such as inflation. Nevertheless, the tourism sector demonstrated steady expansion, a trend clearly reflected in the annual traffic evolution of Athens International Airport.

Passenger traffic at the Airport increased by 13.1% compared to 2023, reaching a total of 31.85 million travellers. Domestic passenger traffic rose by 7.3% compared to 2023, while international passenger numbers experienced even stronger growth at 15.7%, highlighting the Airport's growing global connectivity and the resilience of Greece's tourism and aviation sectors. With respect to the traffic development throughout the year, the strong momentum of the first quarter, with a 16.5% increase compared to 2023, continued into the second quarter at a similar rate (+15.7%), while growth in the 3rd and 4th quarters was not as strong, however it remained robust at 9.8% and 12.3%, respectively.

Aircraft movements totalled 268,301, reflecting an 11.0% increase from the previous year and aligning with the upward trend in passenger demand. Both domestic and international flight operations surpassed 2023 figures, with increases of 5.1% and 15.5%, respectively.

2024 also stands out as a significant one for global air cargo volumes, with Athens International Airport recording its most successful performance to date in this sector. Air cargo traffic reached approximately 125 thousand tonnes, marking a substantial 32.9% increase compared to 2023.

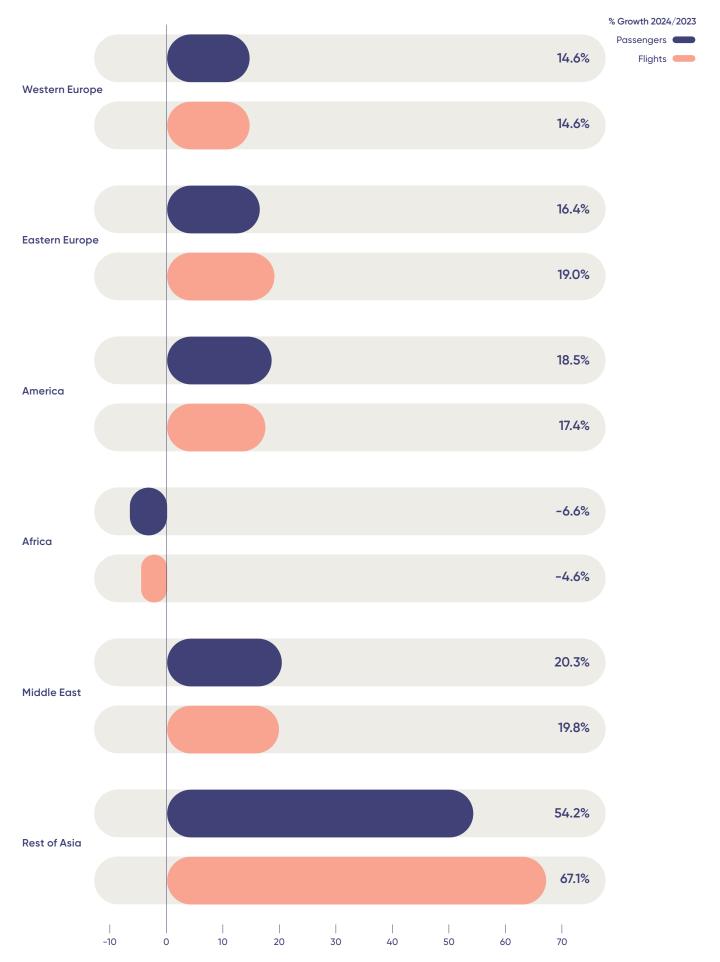

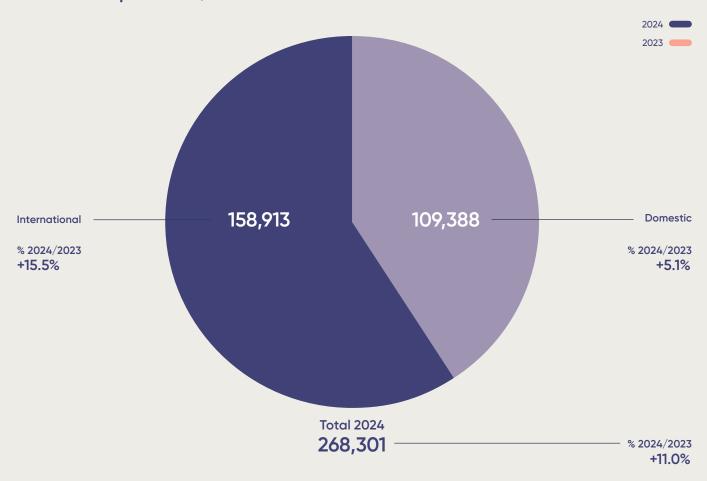

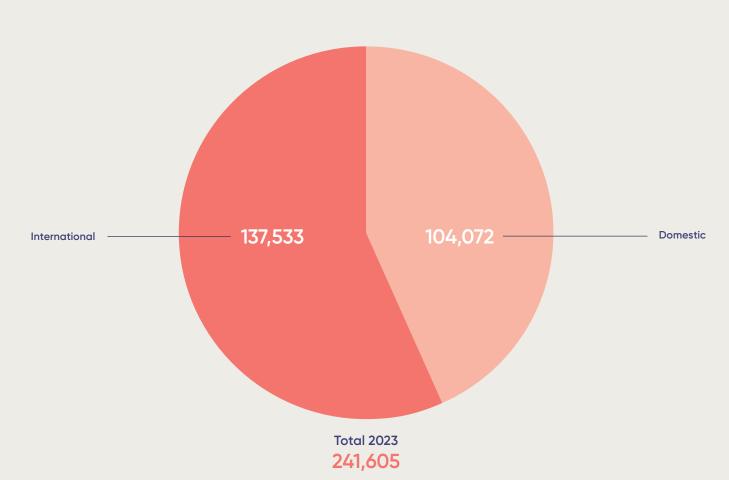


# International Traffic Development per Region 2024 vs 2023

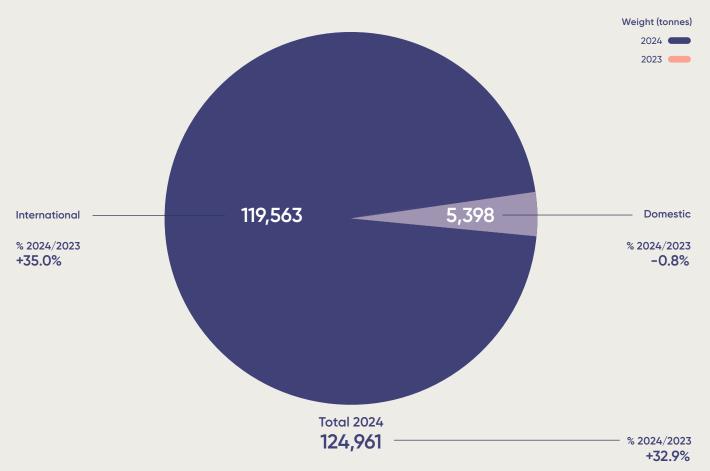


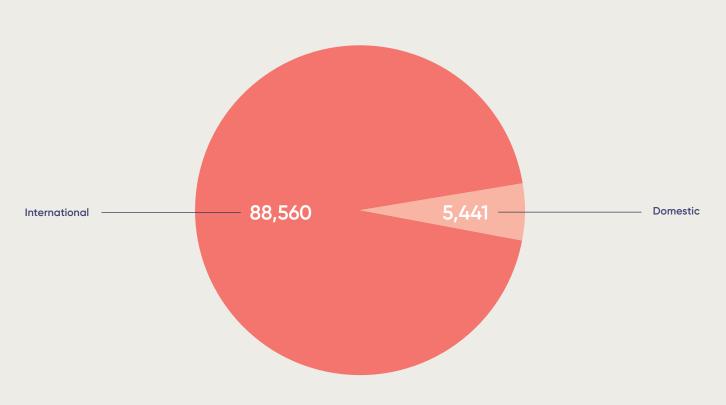
# Traffic Development of A/C Movements 2024

CHAPTER - 2

# How many travelled where

In 2024, total passenger traffic at Athens International Airport climbed to 31.85 million, marking a steady upward trend and representing a 13.1% increase over the previous year Reflecting on the year, Athens International Airport (AIA) experienced an impressive surge in passenger numbers, reaching 31.85 million and solidifying its role as a major airport in the region.

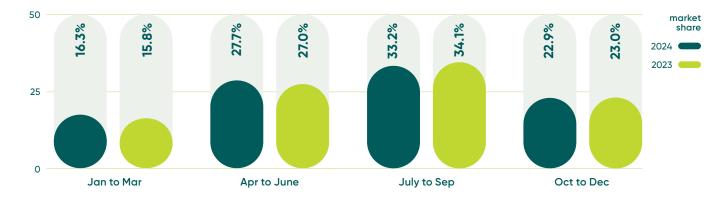
Traffic evolution throughout 2024 reflects strong air travel demand, driven by consumers' prioritisation of experiential spending and the resilience of air travel amid macroeconomic and geopolitical challenges. Passenger traffic posted double-digit growth in most months. Notably, while the summer months continue to drive high volumes, the most significant growth rates were observed outside the traditional peak season—indicating that Greece's tourism season is steadily expanding beyond the summer window.

Looking at the major international scheduled markets for 2024, Italy took the lead with a 10.2% market share and significant year-on-year growth of 21.5%, overtaking Germany, which now holds 9.7% of the market—slightly down from previous years. The United Kingdom remained a key market with an 8.8% share, showing moderate growth of 5.4%. Notably, both the USA and Turkey recorded strong gains, each holding 5.4% of the market and posting impressive increases of 22.8% and 28.2%, respectively. In 2024, Tel Aviv and New York once again led the rankings for non-European scheduled markets to/from Athens, accounting for 21.4% and 15.4% of the sector, respectively. Tel Aviv remained the top performer, growing by 23.7% compared to 2023, while New York followed with a solid 12.7% increase. Among the Gulf destinations, Doha and Dubai recorded strong growth of 16.7% and 18.8%, respectively, while Abu Dhabi stood out with a remarkable 47.2% year-on-year surge, reflecting a sharp rise in demand and connectivity across the Middle East. Conversely, Cairo and Atlanta experienced slight declines, down 8.3% and 2.2%, respectively. Domestically, all the top 10 destinations surpassed 2023 volumes. Notably, Heraklion and Paros marked the highest growth levels, both at around 12% compared to 2023.

In terms of airline performance, Aegean Airlines/Olympic Air, Sky Express, and Ryanair retained their leading positions in market share at Athens International Airport. Among the top three, Ryanair posted the most significant growth, increasing its passenger volume by nearly 26% compared to the previous year. Other notable performers include Volotea and Turkish Airlines, each recording growth rates above 20%. Overall, the strong performance by both legacy and low-cost carriers reflects a healthy, competitive aviation landscape in 2024.

The peak day of the year occurred on Sunday, July 21st, with a throughput of 125,143 passengers, marking the highest recorded figure since the Airport's opening in 2001. Peak day passenger throughput was 11.1% higher than that of the respective peak day in 2023.

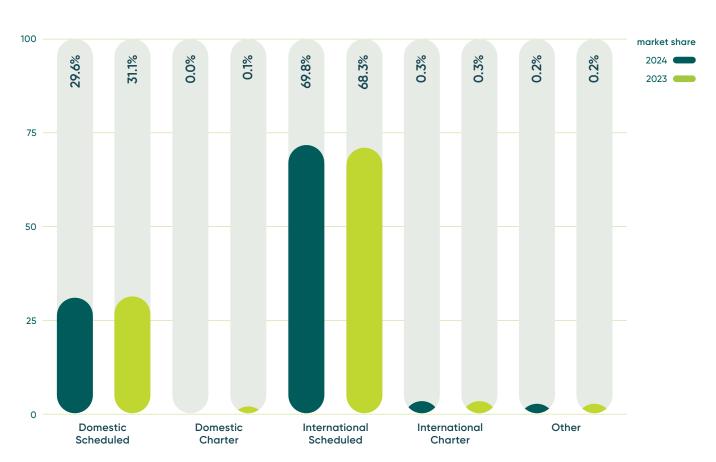

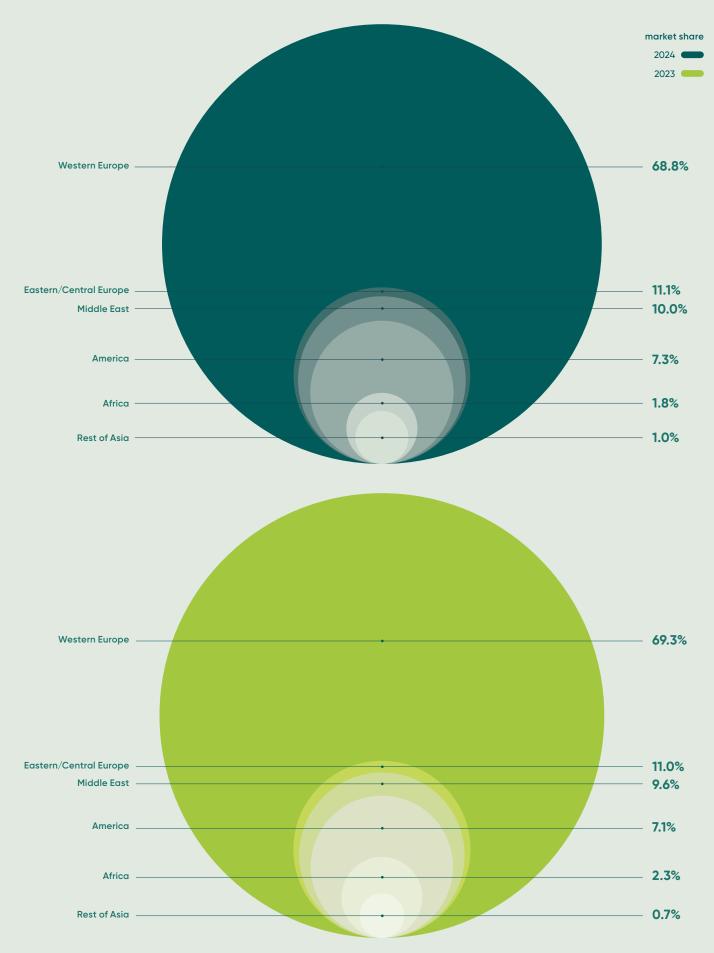

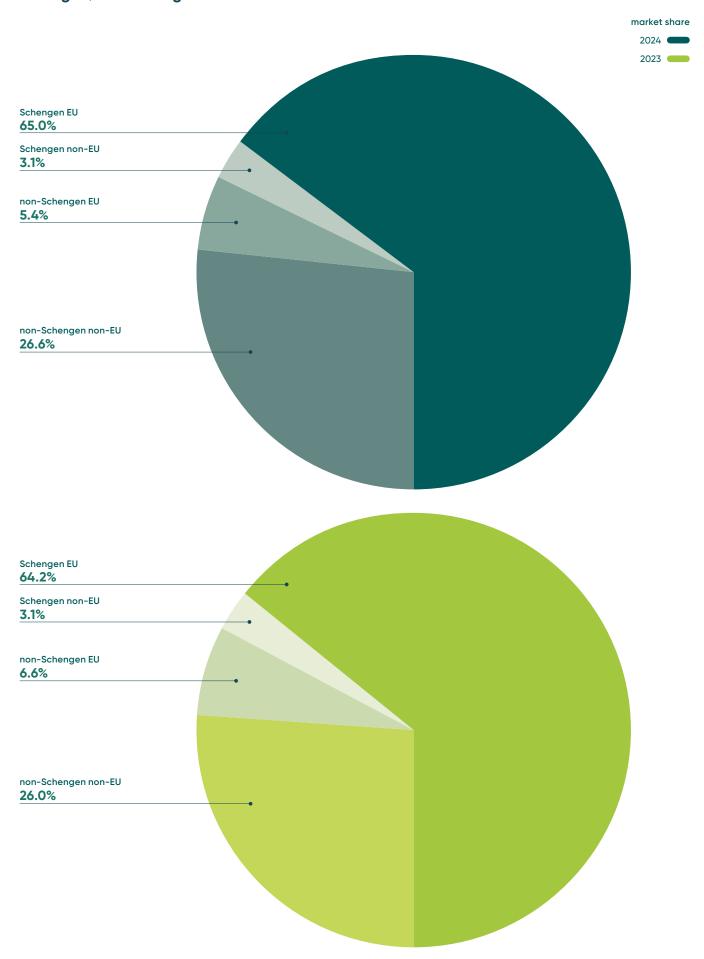
# **Structure of Passenger Traffic**

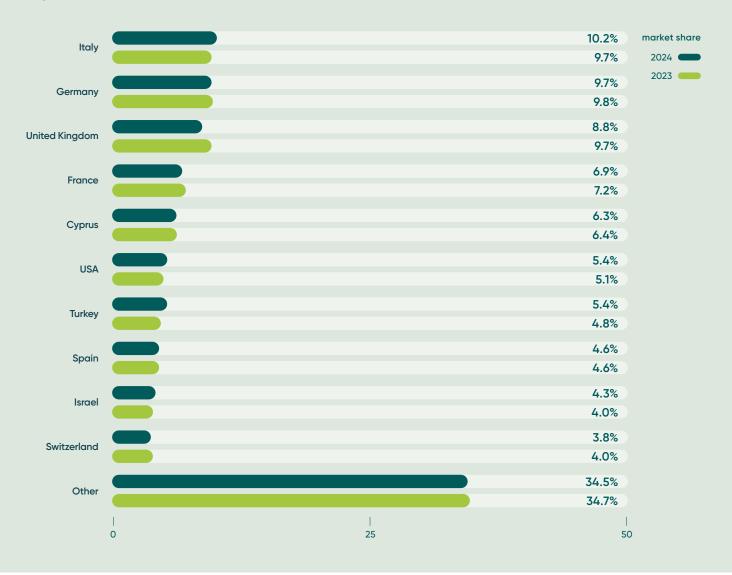

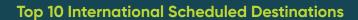

## **Top 10 Airlines According to Total Passenger Traffic**



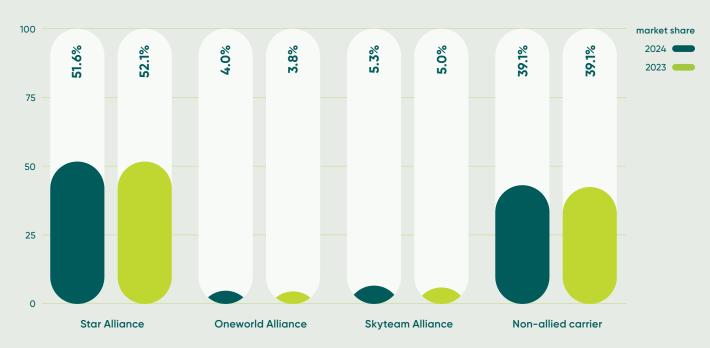
# Low-cost carriers' share in passenger traffic



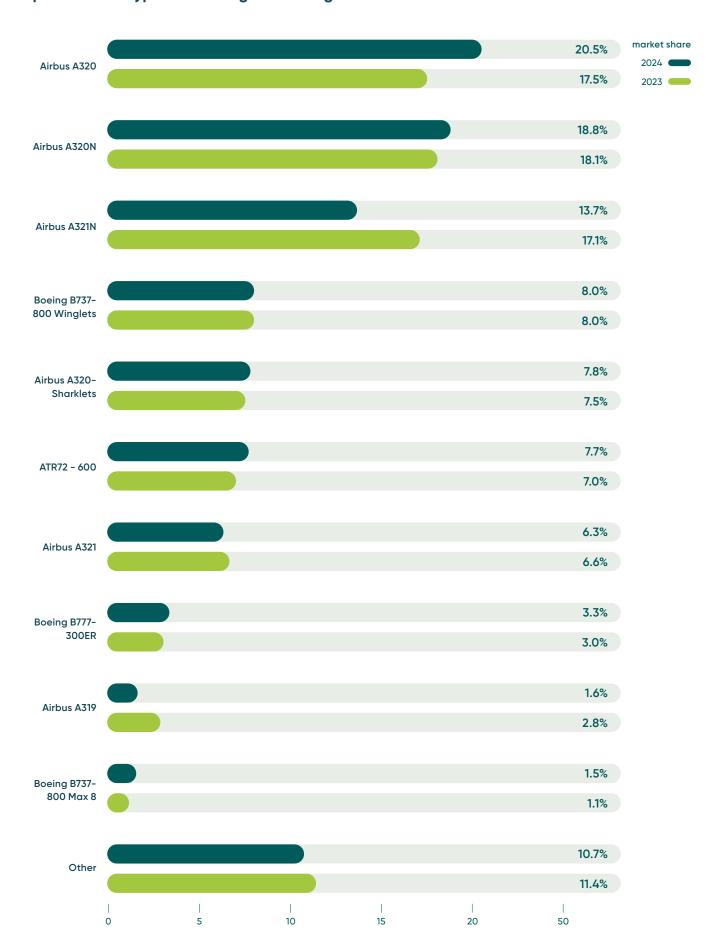
# Load Factors of Non-Stop Flights / Annual Development

CHAPTER - 3

# **Counting Airplanes**

In 2024, aircraft movements reached 268.3 thousand, exceeding 2023 by 11%

Overall, for the year 2024, Athens International Airport's number of flights amounted to 268.3 thousand, reflecting an 11.0% rise over 2023. Domestic flights grew by 5.1%, while international flights recorded a strong 15.5% increase compared to the previous year.

Aircraft movements showed stronger growth during the first half of the year, with increases of 12.8% in the first quarter and 13.9% in the second. Growth in the third and fourth quarters moderated to around 9%. As in previous years, the majority of air traffic activity took place in the second and third quarters, which together accounted for 60% of the total annual movements.

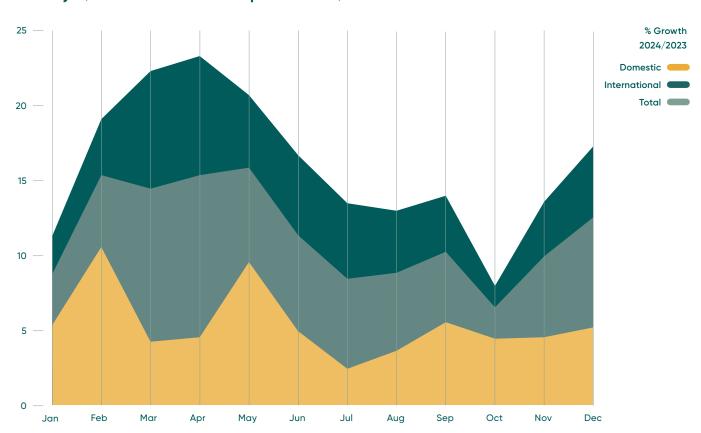
In 2024, Western Europe remained the leading region in terms of international aircraft movements, representing 68.9% of the total. Eastern Europe followed with a 13.2% share, up slightly from 12.8% in 2023. The Middle East accounted for 10.7%, while all other regions individually contributed less than 4% to the total.

All of the top 10 international country markets showed solid momentum in 2024, posting positive growth compared to 2023. Italy stood out as the fastest climber, with a remarkable 23.2% surge in aircraft movements, securing a 10.6% market share. Germany followed closely with a 19.3% rise, while Spain and the USA also achieved strong double-digit gains of 20.6% and 19.7%, respectively. Even traditionally strong markets such as the United Kingdom and France continued their upward trend, albeit at a steadier pace. Overall, this dynamic rebound highlights a robust recovery and growing international connectivity through Athens International Airport.

Aegean Airlines/Olympic Air and Sky Express continued to dominate operations to and from Athens, commanding 45.4% and 19.5% of total aircraft movements, respectively. Ryanair ranked third with a 4.4% market share, up from 3.9% in 2023, signaling steady growth in its operations.

The busiest day of the year in terms of flights was Thursday, August 1st, with 1,029 flights recorded, marking an 8.8% increase compared to the peak day of 2023. The peak day for international flights was July 21st with 593 flights, while for domestic operations it was July 25th with 450 flights.

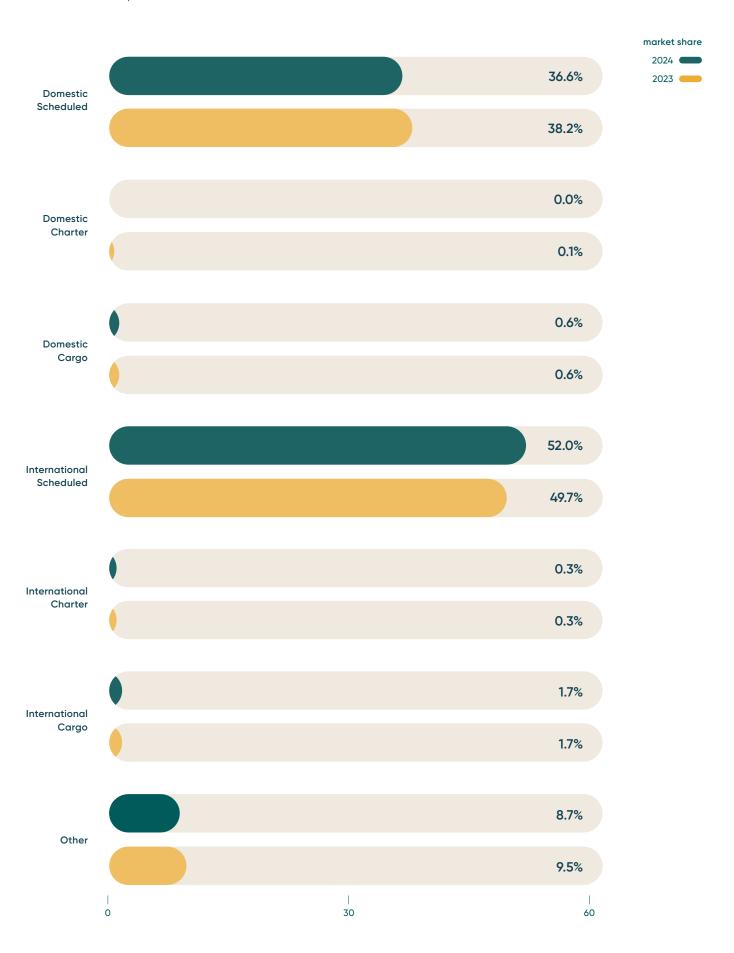

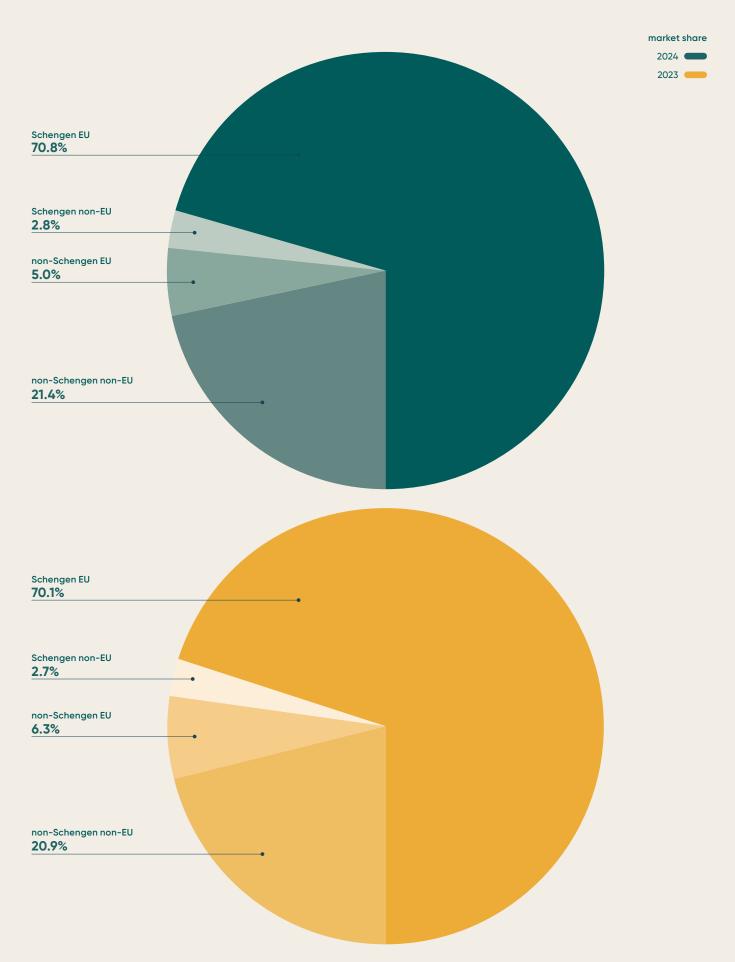

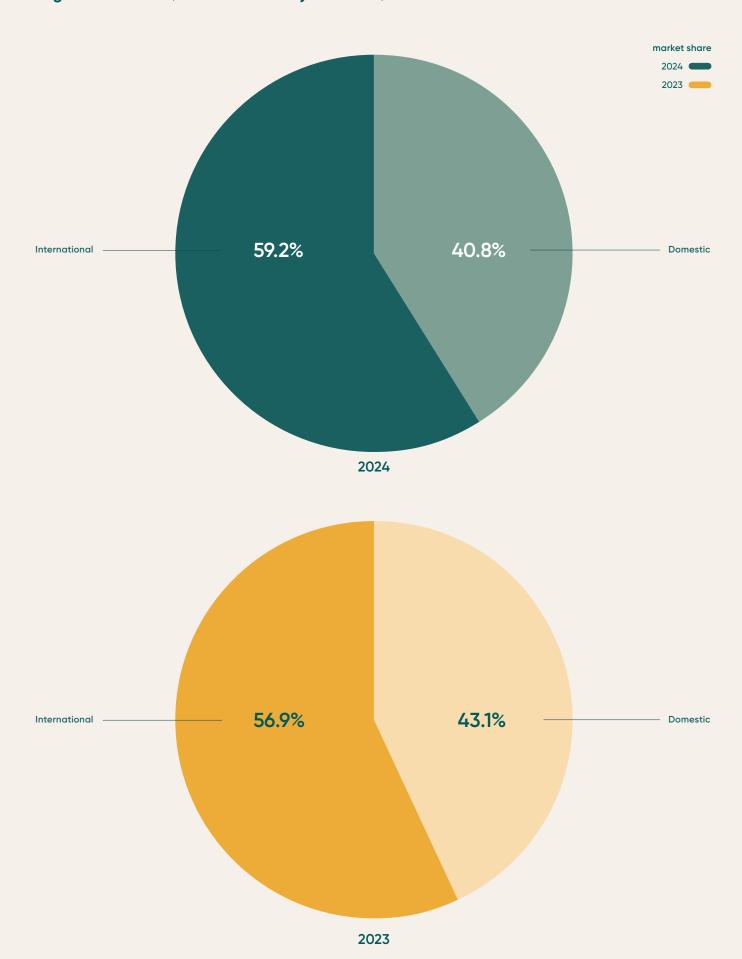
### Structure of A/C Movements Traffic



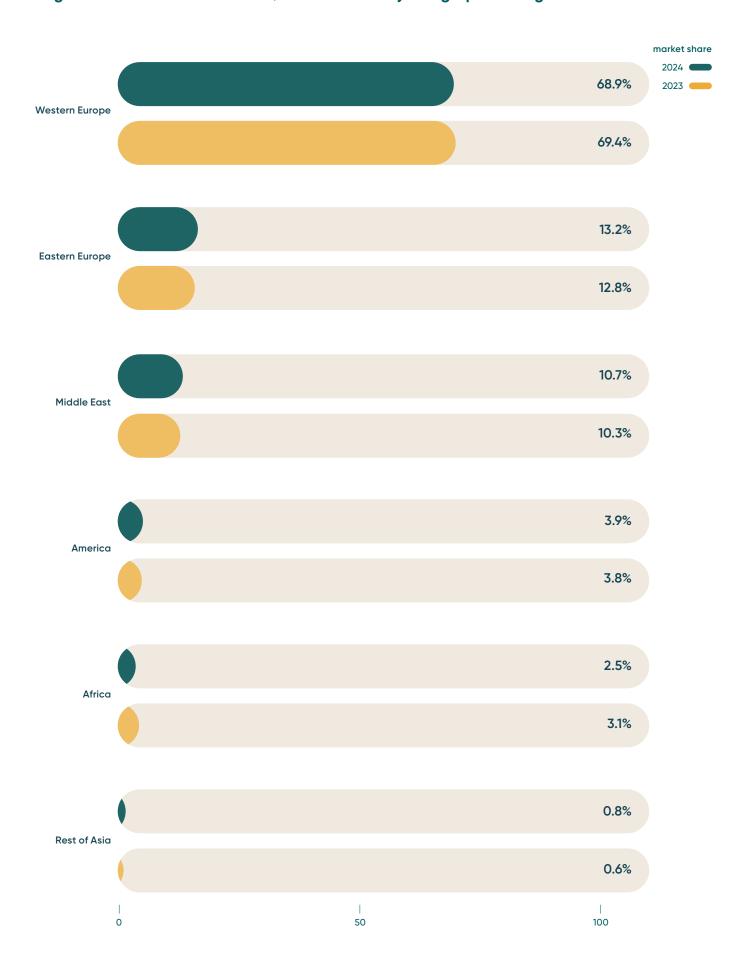
### A/C Movements Breakdown Schengen/EU



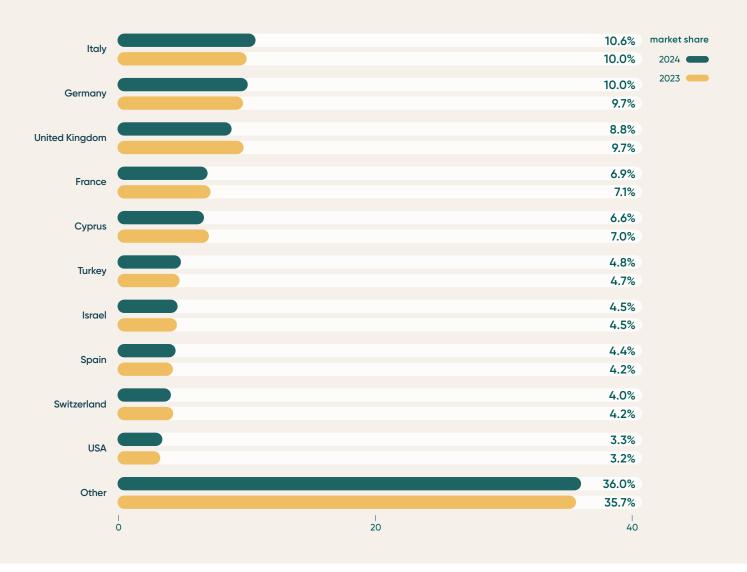
# Segmentation of A/C Movements by Domestic/International



## Segmentation of International A/C Movements by Geographical Region



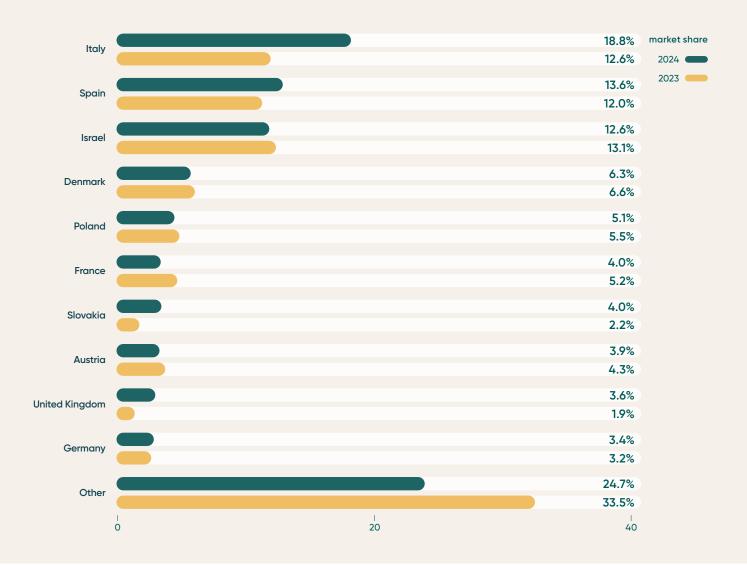

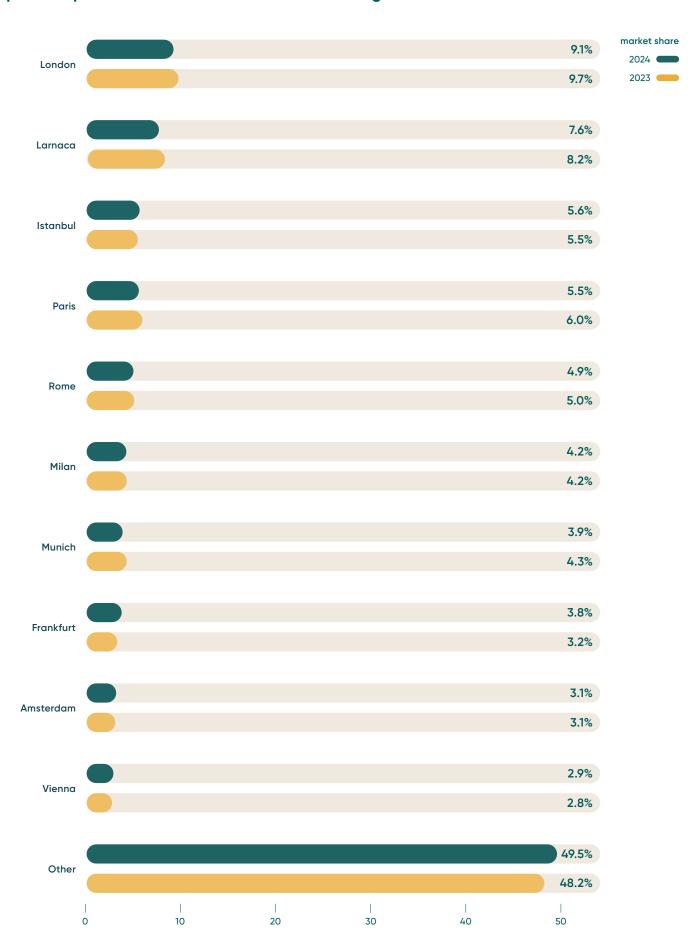
Top 10 International Markets/Countries for Charter Passenger Movements

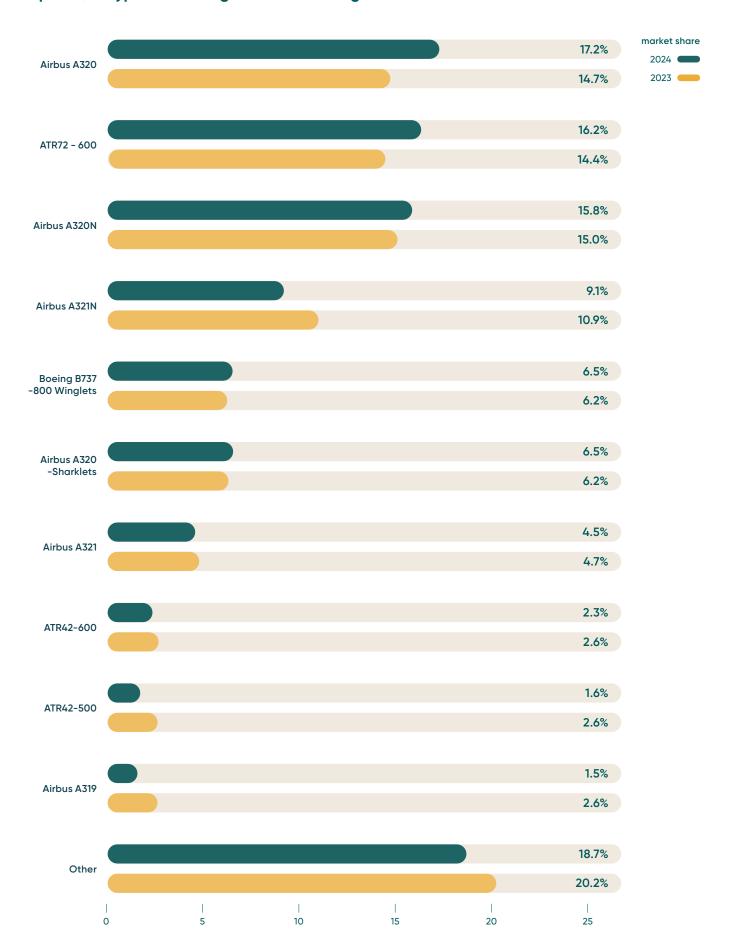

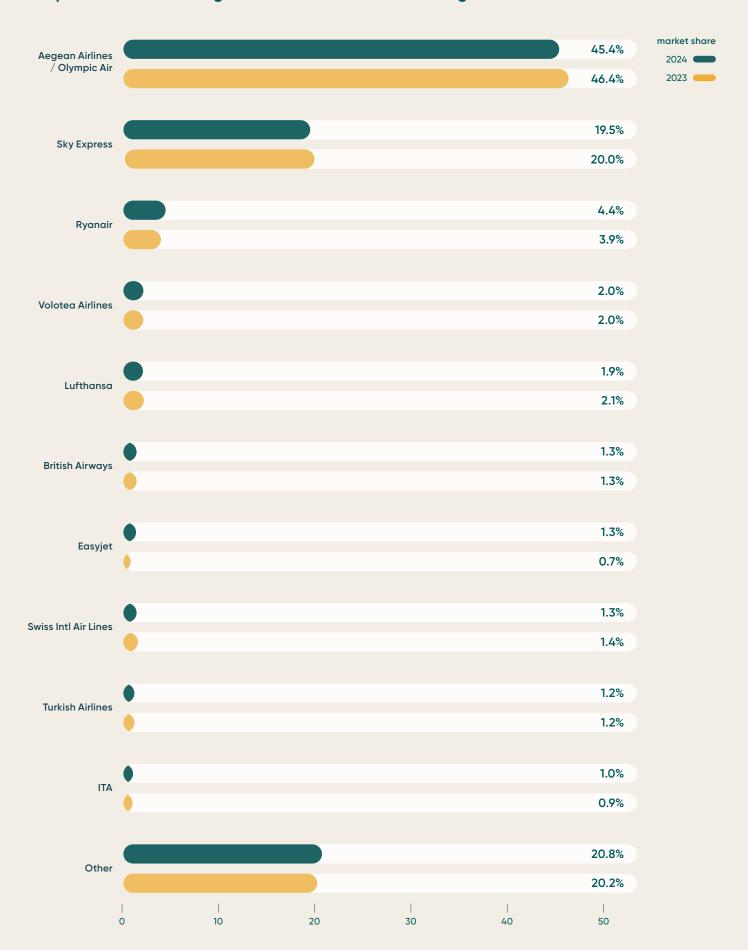

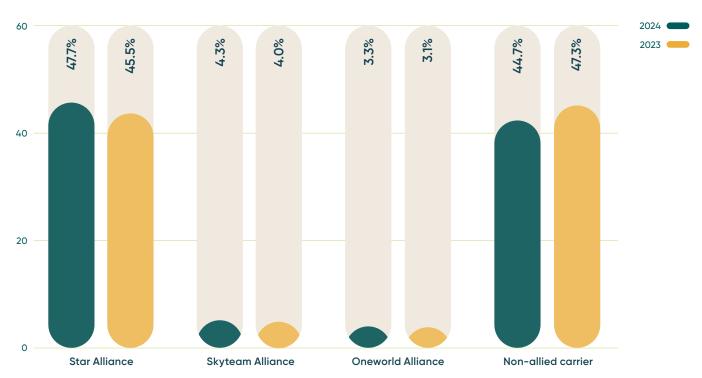
**Top 10 A/C Types According to Number of Flights** 



Top 10 Airlines According to Scheduled & Charter Passenger A/C Movements

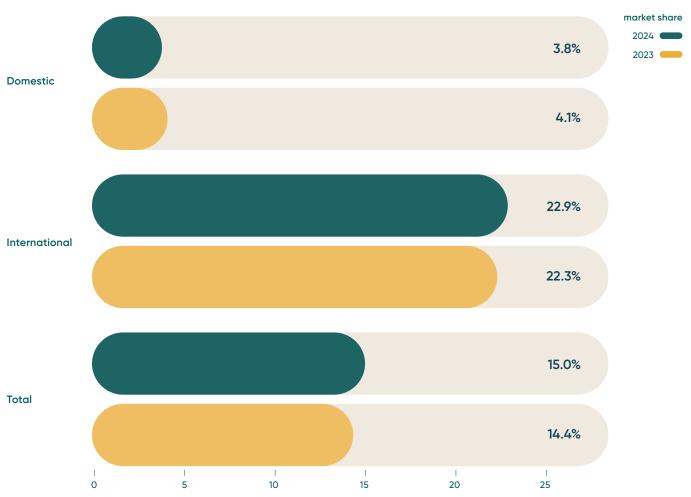


### Alliances' Market Share in Scheduled A/C Movements

CHAPTER - 4

# Tonnes Up in the Sky

Total flown cargo uplift noted almost 125,000 tonnes, marking its best year since 2008 and representing a 32.9% increase compared to 2023

According to IATA's market analysis, global cargo traffic, measured in Cargo Tonne Kilometers (CTK), registered 17 consecutive months of growth, reaching an all-time high in 2024. Traffic surpassed 2023 levels by 11.3%, exceeding the previous record set in 2021 by 0.5%. Despite persistent global challenges such as the war in Ukraine and conflict in the Middle East, which restricted airspace access, most regions and trade lanes experienced annual growth above 5%. This growth was largely fuelled by surging cross-border e-commerce demand, constrained air cargo capacity from/to Asia, and ongoing disruptions in maritime shipping. Global air cargo capacity, measured in Available Cargo Tonne-Kilometers (ACTK), grew by 7.4% compared to 2023, while the average annual cargo load factor rose to 45.9% (+1.6% vs 2023). By the end of the year, air cargo yields remained 53.4% above 2019 levels, and bellyhold capacity (cargo transported in passenger aircraft) accounted for 54.8% of total market capacity, up from 52.5% in 2023.

In line with global trends, Athens International Airport recorded a milestone year in 2024: flown cargo volumes reached approximately 125,000 tonnes, an increase of 32.9% over 2023, exceeding the previous record in 2008. Specifically, freight grew by 34.8% and reached approximately 121,300 tonnes, while mail volumes declined by 8.6%, down to 3,663 tonnes.

International flown cargo volumes increased by 35% compared to 2023, with robust growth in both inbound and outbound traffic. This surge was mainly fuelled by a 47.4% increase in inbound flows, largely linked to the growth in cross-border e-commerce and transit volumes, as well as a 26% increase in outbound flows, boosted by rising transit volumes from neighbouring countries and AlA's extensive scheduled network to North America. Freighter uplift increased by 34.3%, accounting for 38.6% of international cargo volumes (compared to 38.8% in 2023).

Domestic flown cargo volumes remained broadly stable, with a marginal decline of 0.8%. Inbound volumes increased by 1.8% while outbound flows declined by 1.4%. Freighters' market share in domestic traffic rose to 38.2%, up from 36.8% in 2023.

#### Further market highlights include:

- Transfer flown freight nearly doubled, increasing by 94.1%, and accounted for 13.1% of flown volumes (compared to 9.2% in 2023), largely due to increased connectivity with North America.
- International trucked cargo volumes increased by 19.3%, mainly driven by flows from the Balkans and Turkey, as well as the economy services of the international courier companies / integrators (DHL, FedEx and UPS). Transfer trucked volumes increased by 24.3%, now representing 33.7% of total trucked cargo (vs. 32% in 2023).
- Ten airlines carried 75.6% of international cargo volumes: EAT/DHL, Emirates, Turkish Airlines, Aegean Airlines, Qatar Airways, FedEx, UPS (Star Air), United Airlines, Air China, and Lufthansa.
- Five airlines shared the domestic market: Aegean Airlines, EAT/DHL, Sky Express, Swiftair Hellas, and Olympic Air.
- Integrators' market share rose to 31.9% (up from 30.8% in 2023).
- Six cargo airlines operated scheduled services to/from AIA: EAT/DHL, FedEx, UPS (Star Air), EL AL (as of May 2024), Lufthansa Cargo (as of March 2023), and Swiftair Hellas.

At the start of 2025, IATA projected a 5.8% increase in cargo volumes, attributed mainly to continued disruptions in sea transport and the booming e-commerce originating in Asia. However, geopolitical tensions and escalating global trade conflicts may pose risks to this optimistic forecast.

### Structure of Domestic Freight uplift (flown)

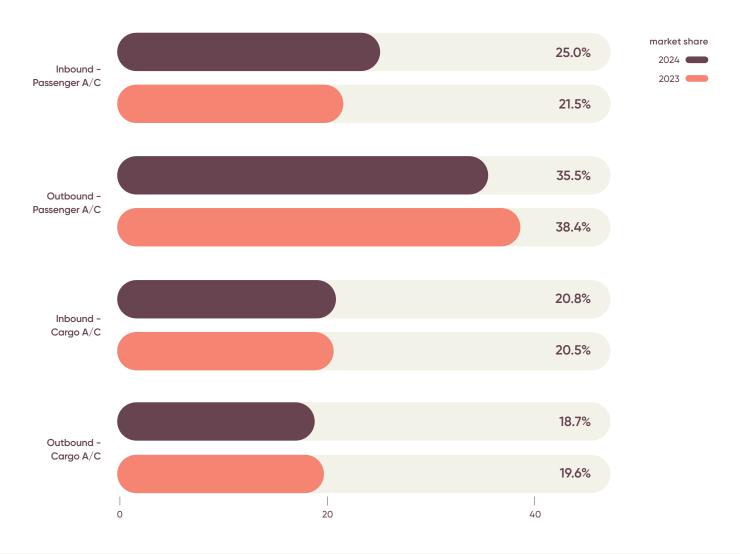


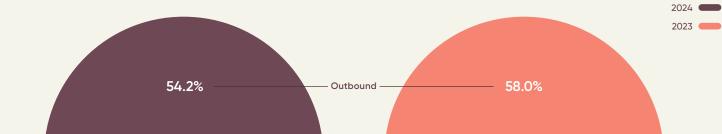

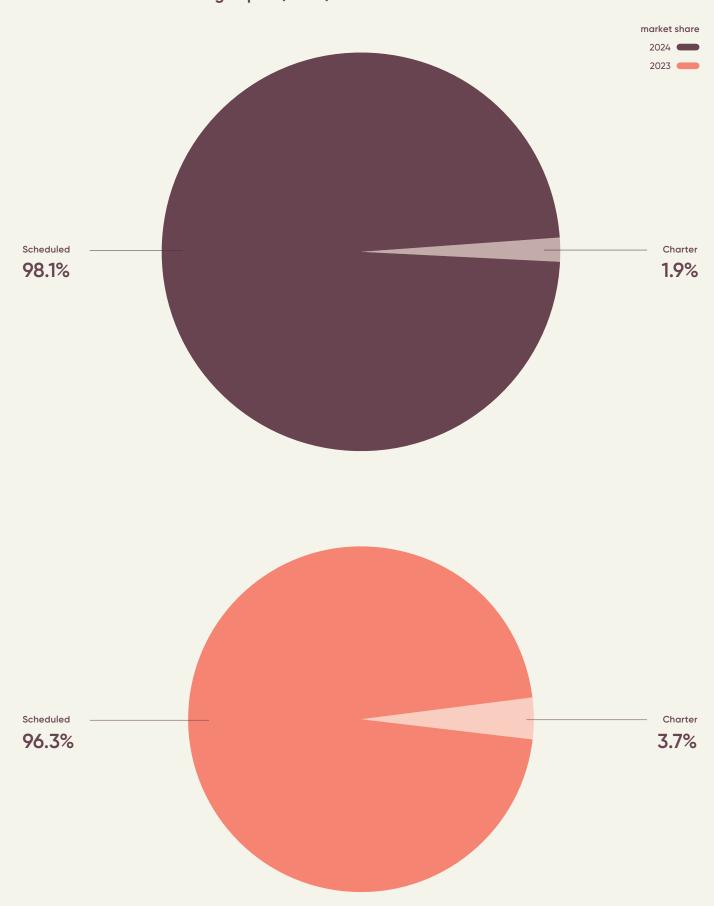

## The network worksheet

In 2024, Athens was directly connected with scheduled services to 157 destinations-cities in 55 countries operated by a total of 68 carriers

In 2024, Athens was directly connected with scheduled services to 157 destinations-cities (compared to 156 in 2023), across 55 countries (from 57 in 2023), operated by 68 carriers (up from 66 in 2023), including 27 low-cost carriers.

The Airport's route network was further expanded with the introduction of six New Destinations and the addition of five New Airlines providing services to Athens. Aegean Airlines inaugurated routes connecting Athens to Sarajevo and Innsbruck; Volotea Airlines commenced services to Brest and Ancona; Air Arabia launched operations to Sharjah; and Juneyao Airlines started flights to Shanghai.

The steady recovery and continuous enhancement of Athens' network connectivity, combined with the impressive growth in passenger traffic and excellence in aviation marketing strategy, were recognised by the airline community. As a result, Athens International Airport was named the best among European airports in the highly competitive category of airports with over 20 million passengers annually at the prestigious "ROUTES EUROPE 2024" awards.

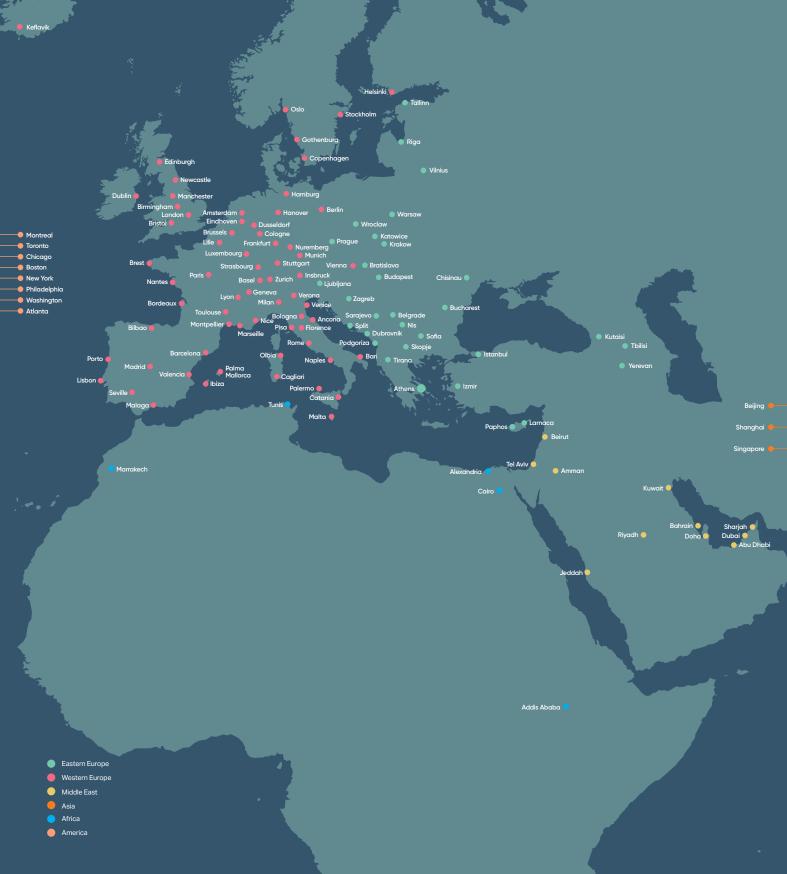

# Exercises on punctuality

In 2024, 38.7% of departing flights experienced delays exceeding 15 minutes

During 2024, 38.7% of all departing flights experienced delays of more than 15 minutes, compared to 36.5% in 2023. The share of delayed domestic scheduled passenger services remained relatively stable at 31%, compared to 30% in 2023. Meanwhile, the percentage of delayed European departures rose from 41.8% in 2023 to 44% in 2024; and delayed Intercontinental scheduled passenger services increased to 44%, up from 37.9% the previous year. The significant increase in the number of flights during 2024 was the key contributing factor behind these developments.

The average delay time for all departing flights remained at 41 minutes, the same as in 2023. For domestic scheduled passenger services, the average delay time also remained steady at 37 minutes. For European scheduled passenger services, the average delay time slightly improved, dropping from 42 minutes in 2023 to 41 minutes in 2024. Conversely, Intercontinental departures recorded a minor increase, reaching 50 minutes in 2024 compared to 49 minutes the previous year.

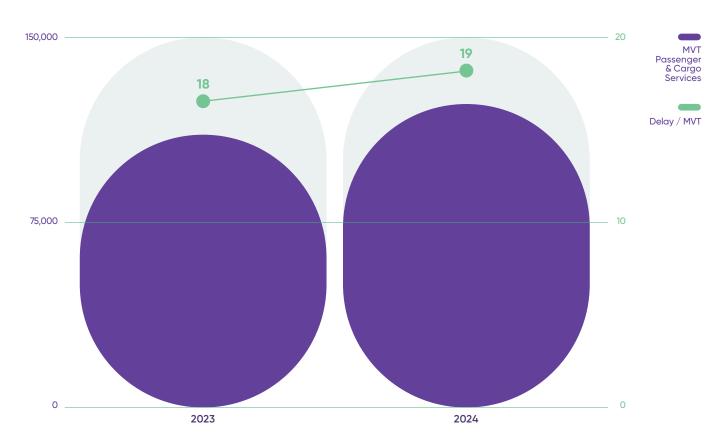
As in previous years, July recorded the highest percentage of delayed departing flights, at 62.6%, followed by June with 56.5% and August with 56.2%. The corresponding average delay times were 45 minutes for July, 43 minutes for June and 42 minutes for August.

In terms of causes, reactionary reasons remained the leading cause of delayed departures, accounting for 38.0% - although this was a significant improvement compared to 41.2% in 2023. Other major reasons for delays in 2024 included:

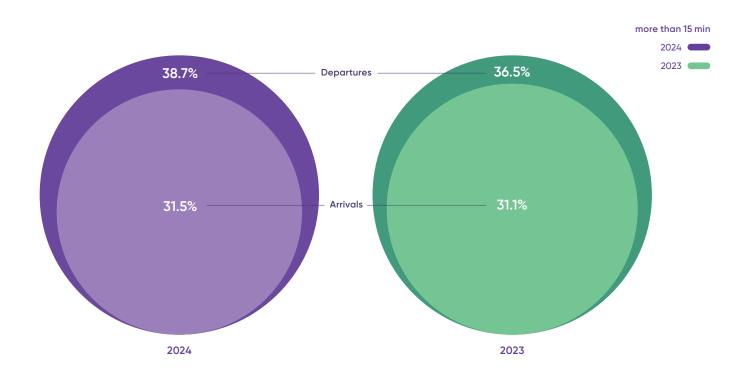
- "Air Traffic Flow Management" with 22.6%, up from 19.0% in 2023.
- "Restrictions at the Airport of Departure" affected 19.4% of delayed departures, compared to 14.7% in 2023, while only 2.4% of delayed departures were attributed to "Airport Facilities" issues.

Finally, the average delay minutes per movement in 2024 stood at 19 mm:ss.

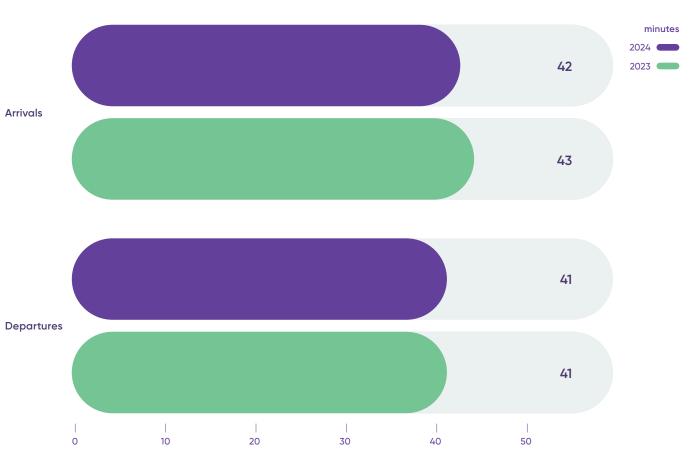
#### Departure Traffic & Average Delay per Movement for Passenger & Cargo Services

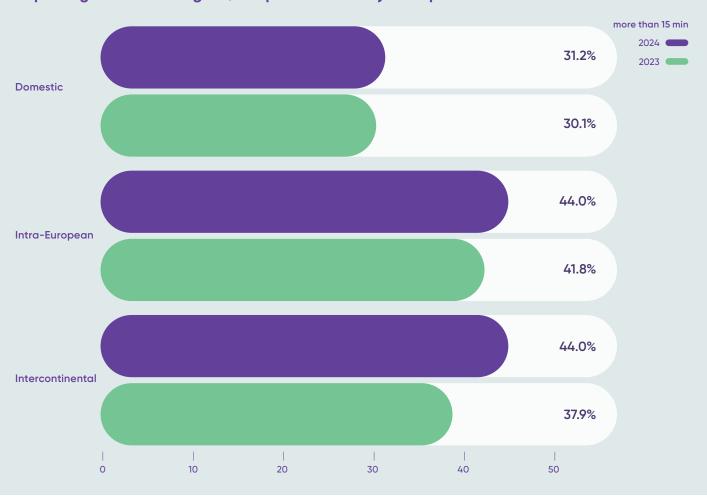

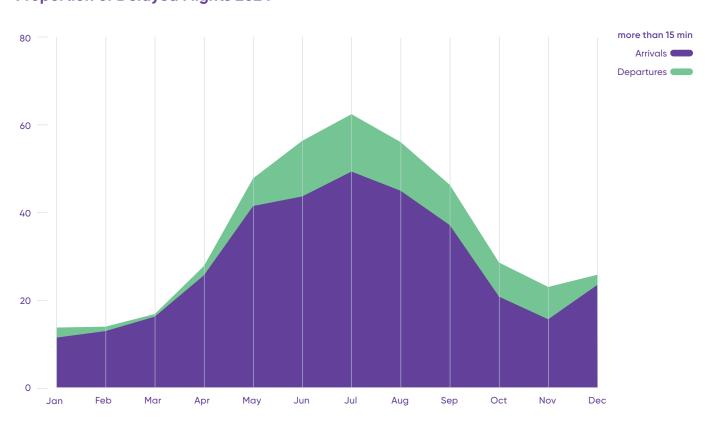

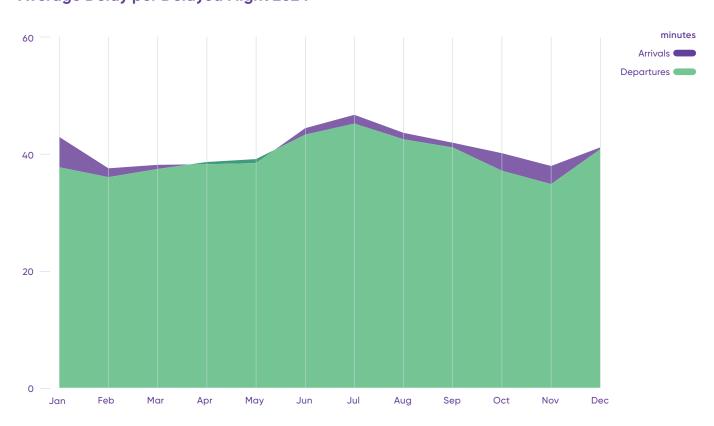

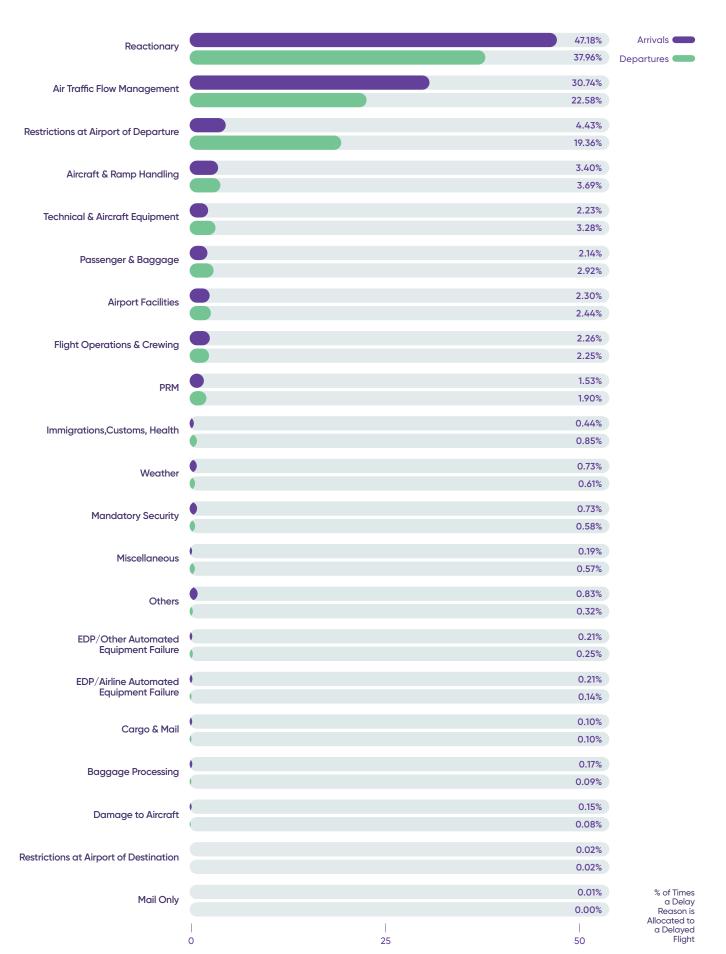

CHAPTER - 7

## Our Grade Report

In 2024, AIA maintained high levels of customer satisfaction, while queue waiting times were sustained and even reduced compared to the previous year, despite a continuous rise in passenger volumes

Athens International Airport regularly assesses the quality of services provided to passengers through a number of tools, including the systematic monitoring of queues at several key operational Airport service points, such as check-in, ticketing, passport control, and security screening, complemented by surveys and direct passenger feedback. To further enhance the passenger experience, AIA initiated the iMind programme, though which staff members conduct regular checks of terminal and parking areas to ensure consistent service quality. Analysis of this data enables both AIA and its business partners to assess and further improve service standards.

Despite a record-breaking year in terms of passenger traffic, no significant operational issues were observed, with queue waiting times being at similar or even lower levels compared to 2023 for most processes.

In 2024, AIA personnel focused on ensuring smooth Terminal Operations & Passenger Experience, responding to more than 8 million passenger and visitor queries, a 20% increase compared to 2023. The Airport Call Centre handled approximately 325,000 telephone inquiries, with nearly 93% of callers served within the first 20 seconds. Additionally, about 5,500 enquiries were received and processed electronically via email. Facilitating elite clientele requirements, over 45,000 passengers were processed through the General Aviation Facility.

Passenger feedback remains a key metric for evaluating the quality of airport facilities and services. Throughout 2024, AIA maintained consistently high passenger satisfaction levels, despite unprecedented traffic growth. Core service areas, including cleanliness and commercial facilities, consistently scored above the "4-Good" benchmark on a 5-point scale, demonstrating both sustained service excellence and operational resilience.

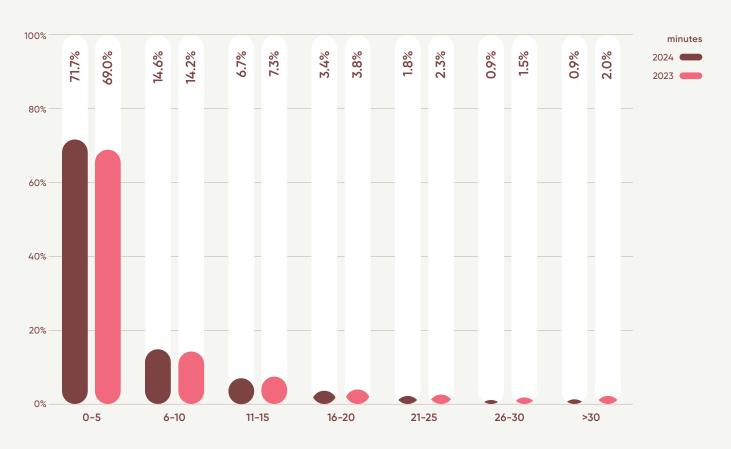
In line with its Commitment to service improvement, AIA placed a strong emphasis on passenger comment management. In 2024, 1,864 comments (complaints/requests/positive/suggestions) were received from 833 passengers, compared to 4,490 comments from 963 passengers in 2023, marking a significant drop from the previous year. This remarkable drop is mainly attributed to the decrease in the number of requests as recorded to our call center in relation to STB facilities and to "curbside rules enforcement". The main area of dissatisfaction for 2024 identified was "lost & found telephone response". A total of 553 letters of response were issued, with 99.99% being personalised. The average response time was 10.8 days.

Through the iMind programme, 2,668 inspections were carried out by 501 employees during 2024, further reinforcing AlA's commitment to maintaining and enhancing service quality. There were 138 "Alerts" raised (cases where immediate action is required).

#### **Check-in Queues - All Airlines / Queuing Time Distribution**



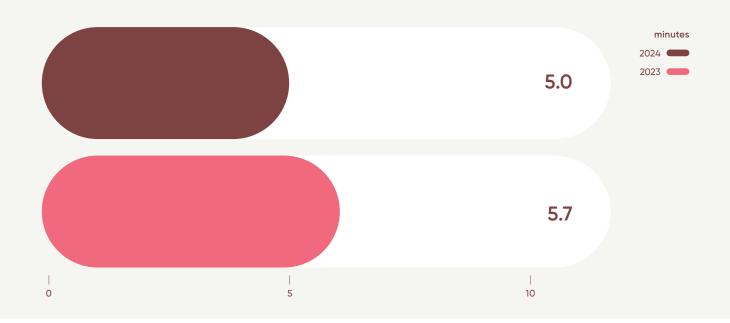

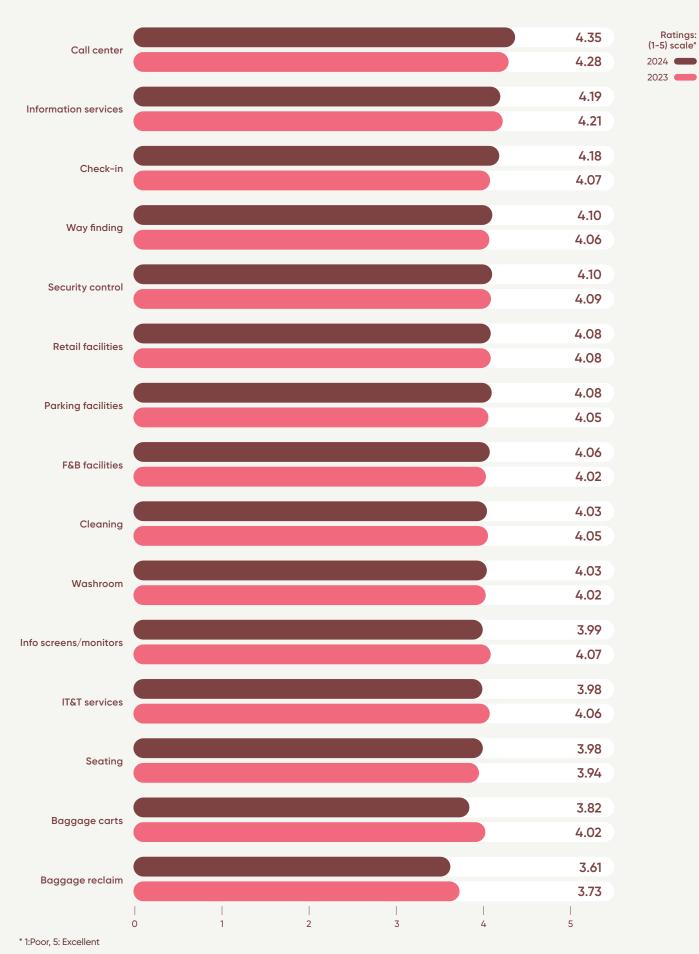
#### Call Centre Waiting Time Under 2 min



#### Baggage Delivery Service / Average Time for First and Last Bag from "on-blocks" Time

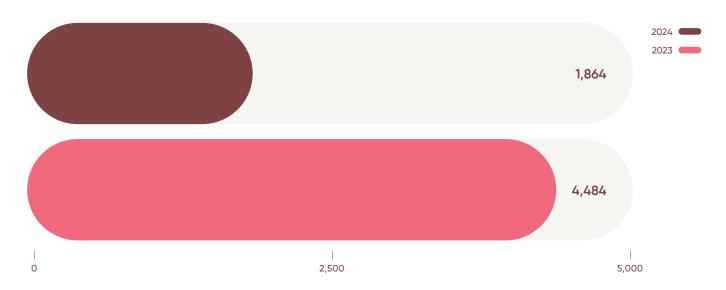

CHAPTER - 8

# Joining the Passenger Dots

Passengers' profile in 2024 was similar to that of 2023, signifying a stabilization in travel trends

The demographic and travel profile of passengers to and from Athens remained largely unchanged compared to the previous year.

In terms of gender, there was an almost equal distribution, with male passengers accounting for 52% of total traffic, compared to 51% in 2023. In terms of age, the 35-44 age group continued to lead at 29% (30% in 2023), followed by the 25-35 & 45-54 age groups, with 25% and 23% shares, respectively (23% each in 2023). The two extreme age categories followed: the 55+ age group accounted for 16% and the 18-24 group for 7%, reflecting the same pattern as last year (17% and 7%, respectively).

Foreign residents accounted for 63% of total passenger traffic, very close to 64% in 2023. Most came from the EU (29%) and the USA/Canada (13%), with the latter showing a slight decrease compared to the previous year (15%). Greek residents represented 37% of traffic, almost identical to 2023, with Greek nationals making up 39% compared to 40% in 2023.

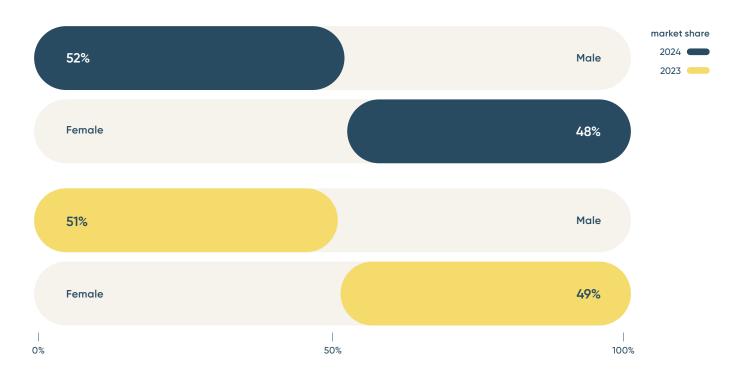
The average travel frequency from Athens International Airport was 2.4 trips per year, slightly lower than 2.9 trips in 2023. The average length of stay for foreign residents remained stable at 10 days, and similarly their stay in Athens remained consistent at 3 days. Greek travellers spent an average of 8 days at their destination, slightly down from 9 days in 2023. A slight decline was also evident in general travel activity, with the average number of trips per person dropping to 4.7 in 2024 compared to 5.5 in 2023.

The return of business travellers observed in 2023 remained consistent throughout 2024. A significant majority (82%) of business travellers cited business meetings as their primary reason for travel, representing a slight decrease from 87% the previous year. Other business travel purposes remained largely unchanged. Personal travel trends closely mirrored those of the prior year, with "Holidays/Tourism" being the main reason for travelling at 71% (70% in 2023), followed by "Visiting friends and relatives" at 24% (same as 2023).

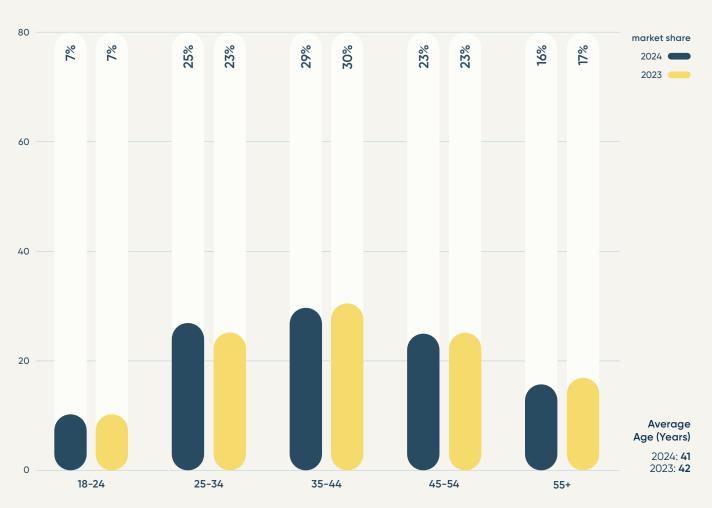
In 2024, notable changes were observed in ticket booking methods. The airline's website remained the preferred booking platform, accounting for 75% of reservations—an increase from 68% in 2023. The average booking lead time also extended significantly, from 53 days in 2023 to 67 days in 2024. The trend was consistent across both Greek and foreign travellers: Greek passengers booked an average of 46 days in advance (compared to 37 days in 2023), while foreign travellers booked 79 days ahead of departure (up from 62 days in 2023).

Transfer passenger movements in 2024 mirrored the previous year's patterns. Transfers between a domestic and an international destination slightly increased to 77% (from 75% in 2019), with INT-INT and DOM-DOM transfers accounted for 16% and 7%, respectively. Among domestic destinations for transfer passengers, Santorini led with 22%, followed by Thessaloniki with 10% and Heraklion with 9%. For international destinations, USA was the top market with 11% of connecting passengers, followed by Germany with 9% and the United Kingdom with 8%.

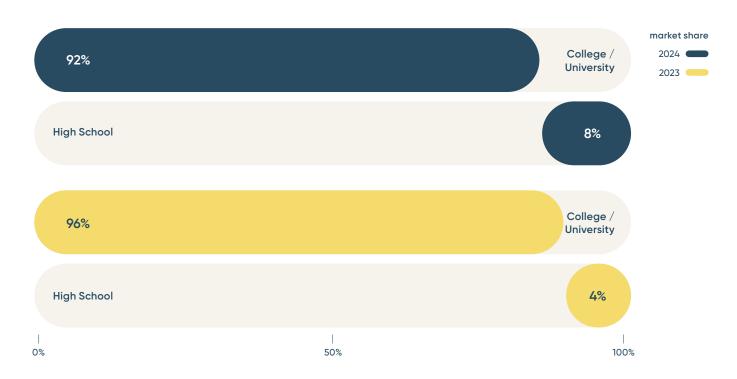

# Adding Tourists

2024 second consecutive record year with 7.9 million foreign visitor arrivals

Foreign visitor arrivals at Athens International Airport reached 7.9 million in 2024, surpassing 2023 and setting a new all-time high. The vast of international travellers visited Greece for leisure and to visit friends & relatives.

Europe remained the primary source of inbound travellers, representing approximately 70% of all foreign arrivals. Arrivals from the Americas continued to grow, securing second place in terms of inbound traffic. Western Europe led the regional breakdown, with the United States, the United Kingdom, and Germany emerging as the top leisure travel markets. The Asian Pacific region also showed signs of recovery, stabilizing after recent challenges and following trends similar to those observed in 2023.

In 2024, a notable shift in travel behaviour was seen in the number of passengers continuing their journey via Athens International Airport: approximately 60%, up significantly from 38% in 2023. Among these leisure travellers, Santorini remained the most preferred onward destination, followed by Heraklion and Paros. However, Santorini's share declined compared to 2023, and for the first time, Mykonos experienced a decrease in passenger preference.

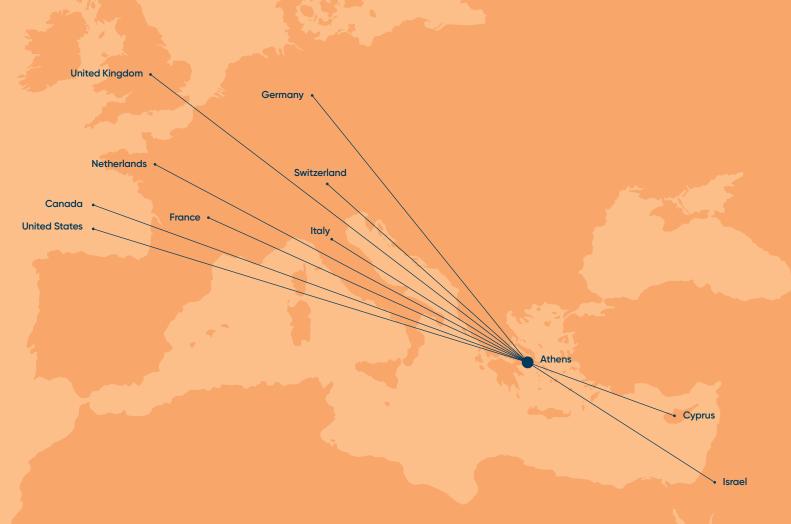
Business incoming traffic also recorded an uptick in 2024. Most business travellers came from European countries and stayed in Athens for an average of 7 days, consistent with 2023. Additionally, business travel from the Middle East showed an increasing trend.

Outbound travel by Greek residents continued its upward trajectory, with international trips rising by24% compared to the previous year, reaching 3.2 million (from 2.6 mio in 2023). Italy, the United Kingdom and Germany were the top international destinations. On average, leisure trips abroad lasted 10 days, while business trips averaged 7 days.

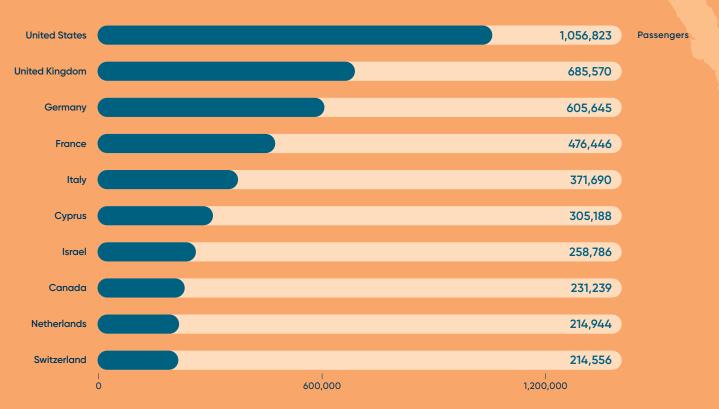

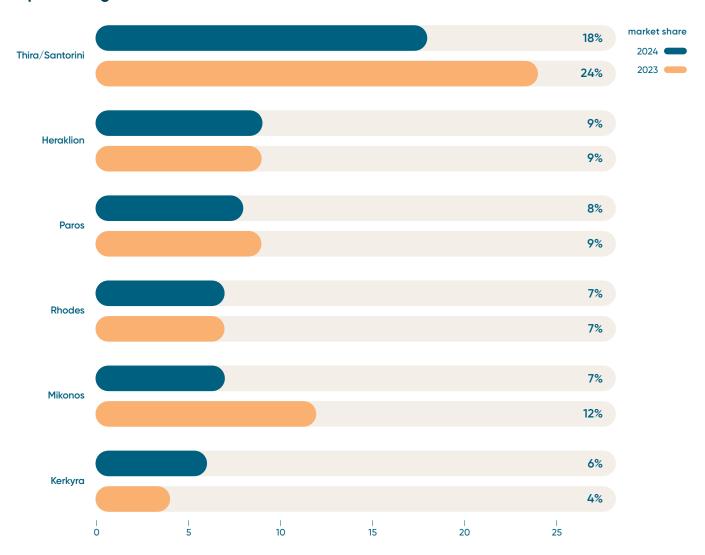




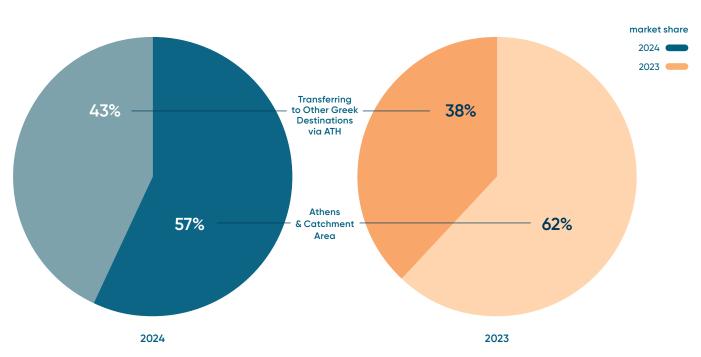
**Top 10 Countries of Incoming Leisure Traffic Arrivals 2024** 



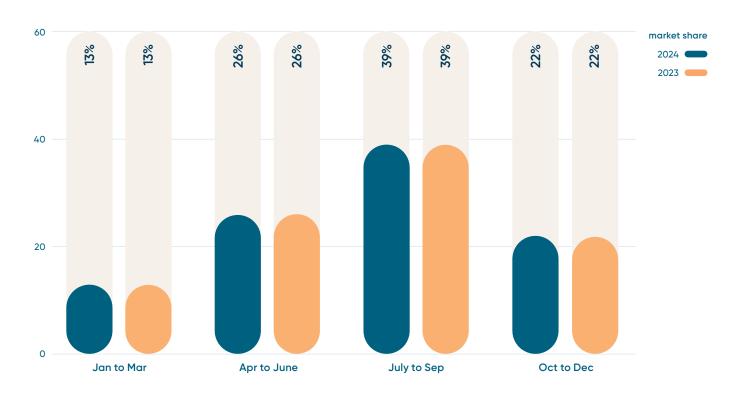
# **Top Incoming Leisure Traffic Destinations in Greece via Athens**



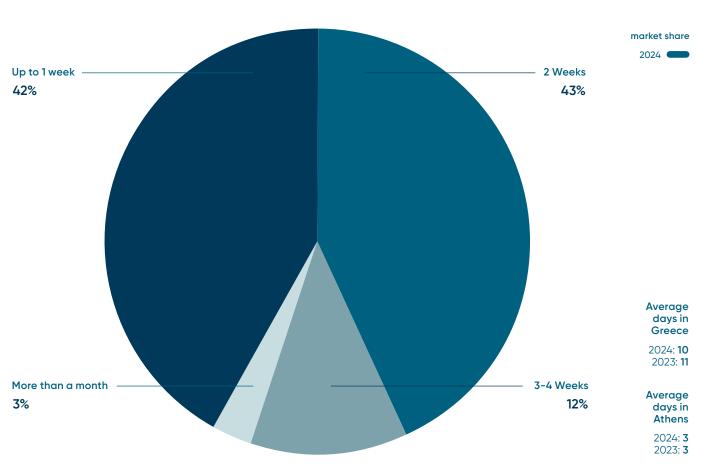
# **Incoming Leisure Traffic Visiting Athens & Catchment Area**



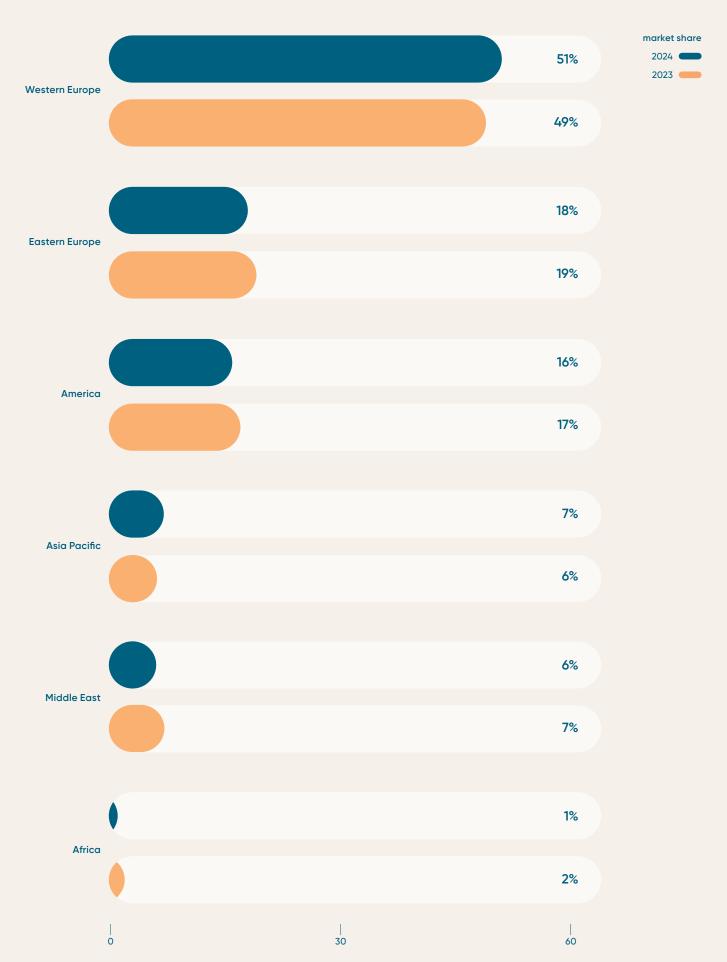
# **Seasonality of Incoming Leisure Traffic Arrivals**



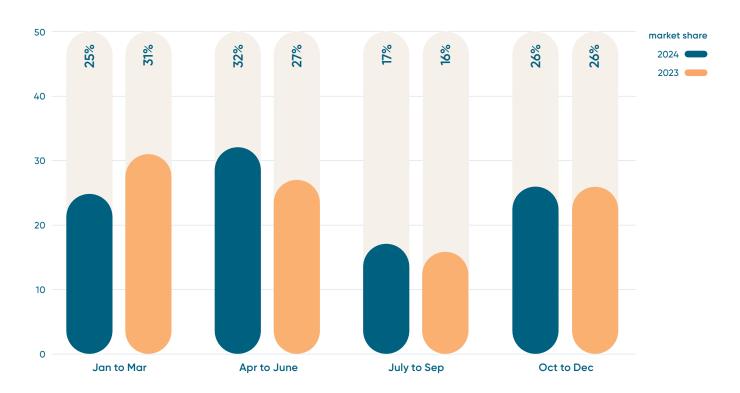
# **Length of Stay in Greece - Incoming Leisure Traffic**



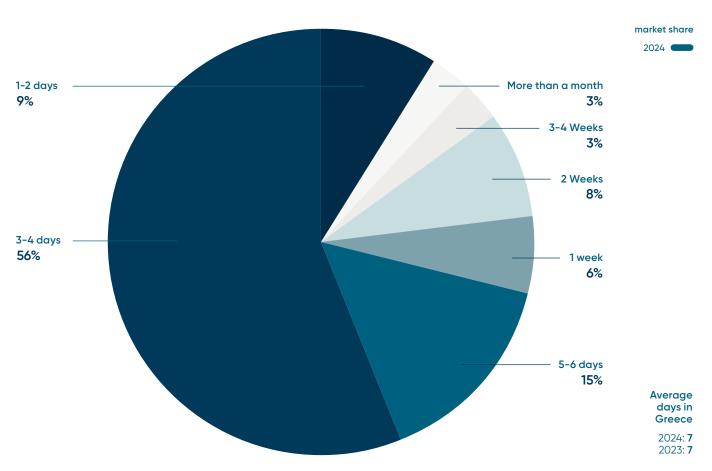
# **Incoming Leisure Traffic Arrivals per Geographical Region**



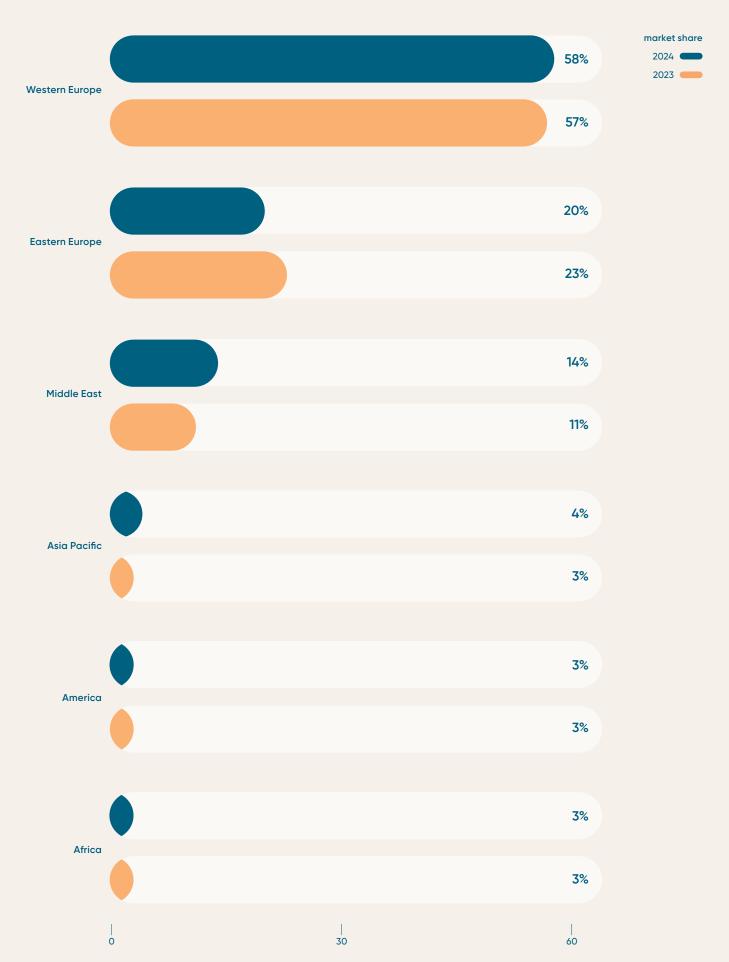
# **Seasonality of Incoming Business Traffic Arrivals**



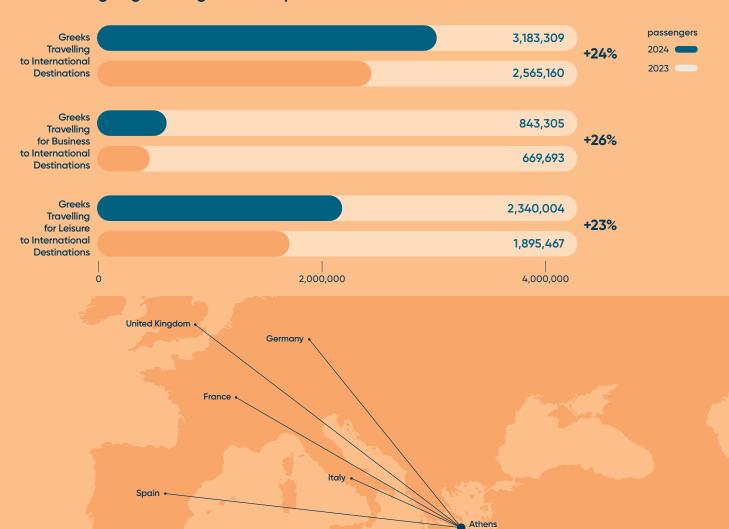
# Length of Stay in Greece - Incoming Business Traffic



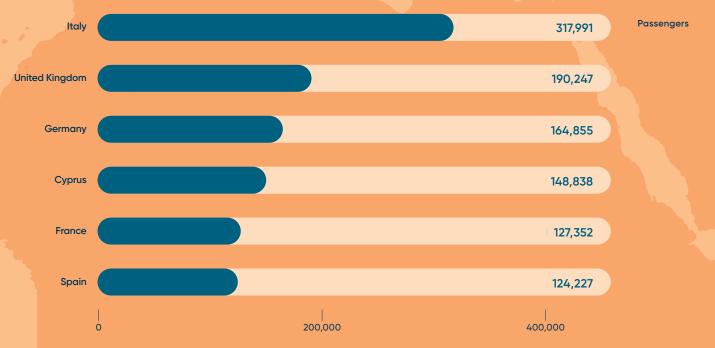
# **Incoming Business Traffic Arrivals per Geographical Region**

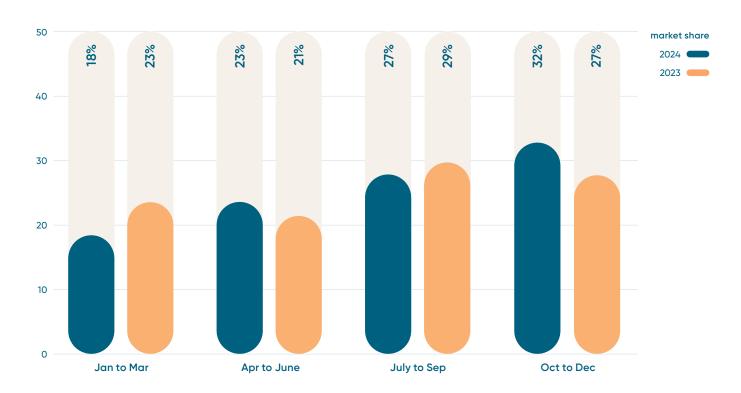


**Top Destination Countries of Greek Leisure Traffic Departures 2024** 

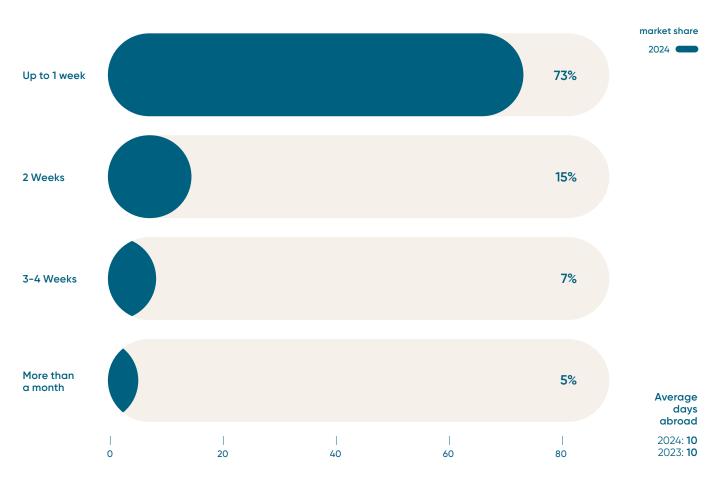

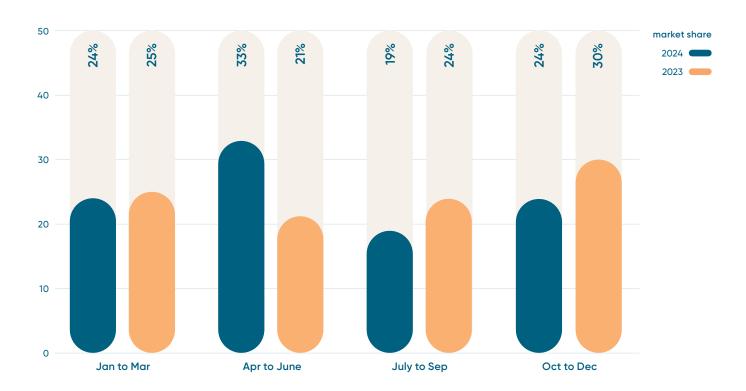
# Seasonality of Greek Leisure Traffic Departures



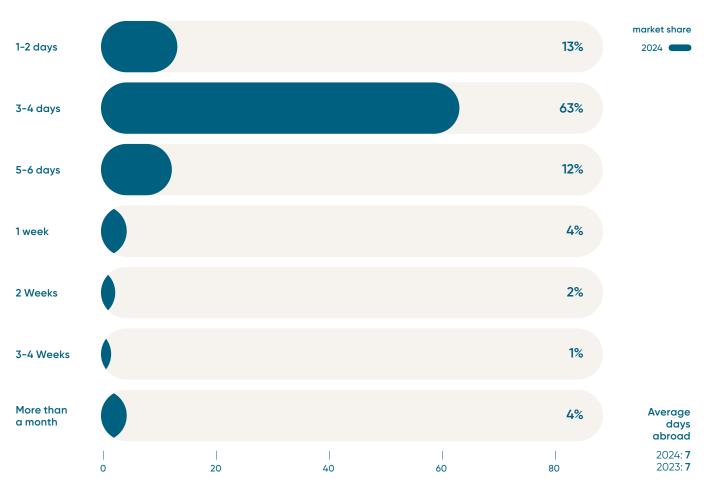
# Length of Stay Abroad - Greek Leisure Traffic



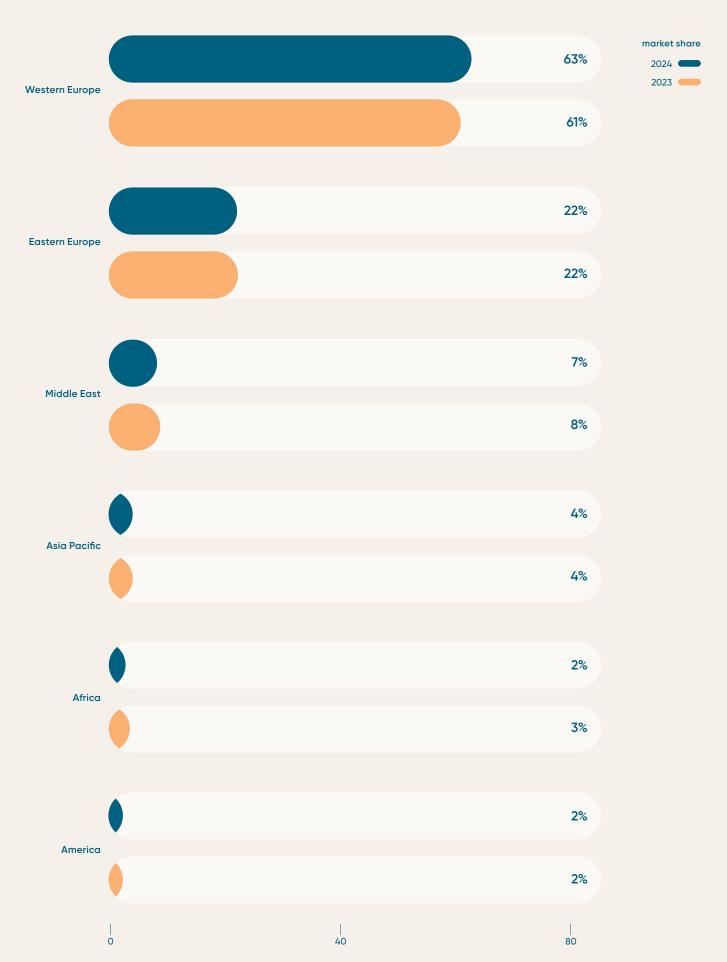
# **Seasonality of Greek Business Traffic Departures**

CHAPTER - 10

# Greek Arithmetic

The Greek aviation market is continuously growing, reaching 79.4 million in 2024, marking a 10.4% increase compared to 2023

Throughout 2024, the Greek aviation industry experienced substantial growth, reaching a total of 79.4 million passengers. This marks an increase of 7.5 million travellers, representing a 10.4% year-on-year rise, driven by significant growth in both domestic and international air traffic.

Domestic travel grew by 7.3%, while international passenger numbers rose by an impressive 11.6%, highlighting the sustained momentum of the country's air transport industry.

Athens and Thessaloniki, the county's two major year-round airports, recorded overall traffic (domestic and international) increases of 13.1% and 9.8%, respectively. Athens experienced a strong 15.8% rise in international passengers, while Thessaloniki recorded an 11.3% in the same category. Among island destinations, Rhodes stood out with a 17.3% overall growth, including a 19.1% increase in international traffic. Other regional airports, such as Heraklion and Corfu, also performed strongly, with domestic and international traffic rising by more than 7%.

Athens International Airport maintained its leading position, holding a 39.9% market share of total passenger traffic in 2024, slightly up from 38.5% in 2023. It was followed by Heraklion with an 11.8% share and Thessaloniki in third place with 9.3%.

In 2024, commercial aircraft movements in Greek airspace totalled 613 thousand, reflecting a 9.4% increase over 2023. Both international and domestic traffic exceeded 2023 levels by 7.1% and 10.8%, respectively.

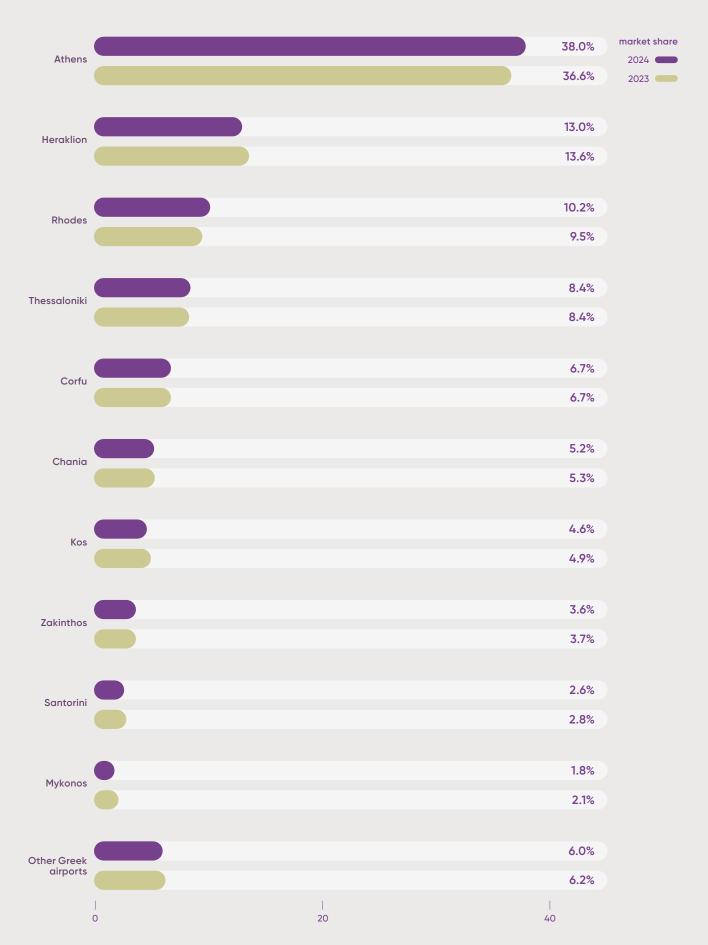
**Top 10 Greek Airports According to Total Passenger Traffic** 



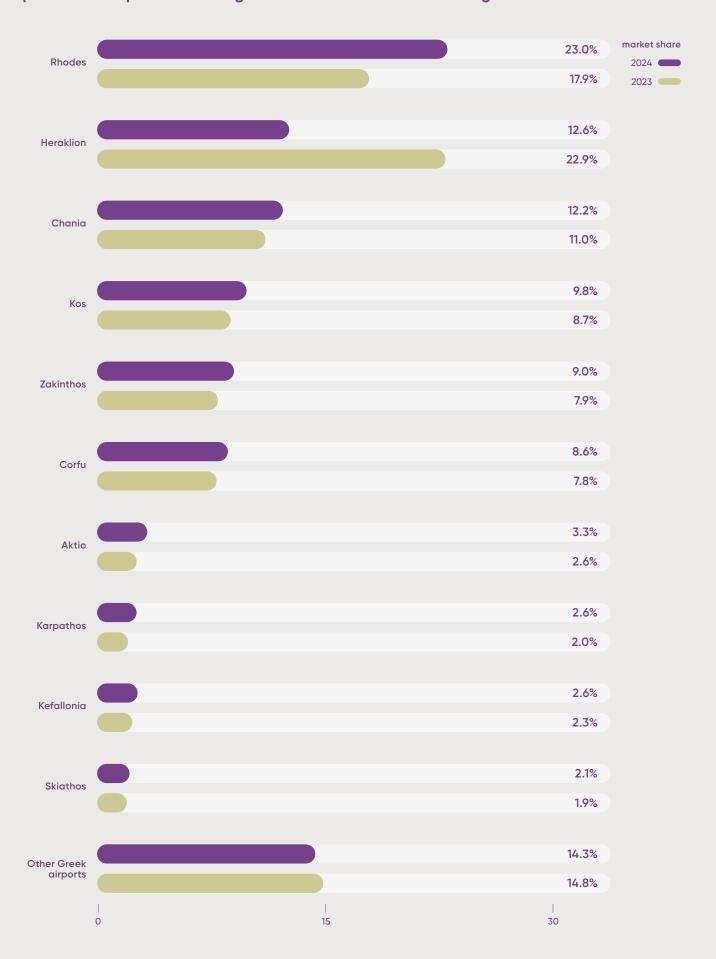
**Top 10 Greek Airports According to Domestic Passenger Traffic** 



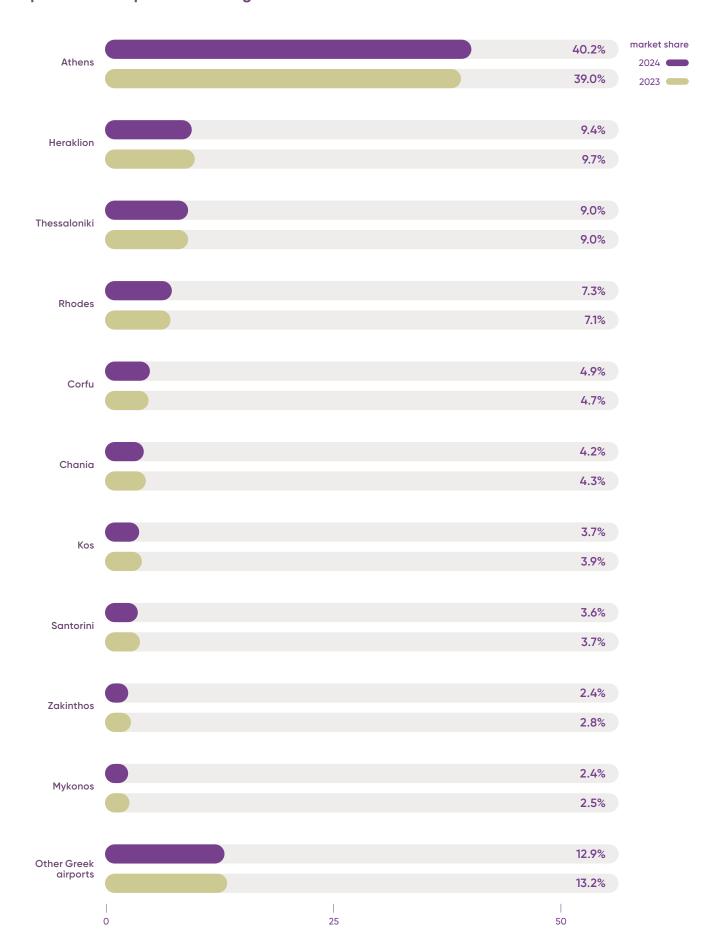
Top 10 Greek Airports According to International Passenger Traffic



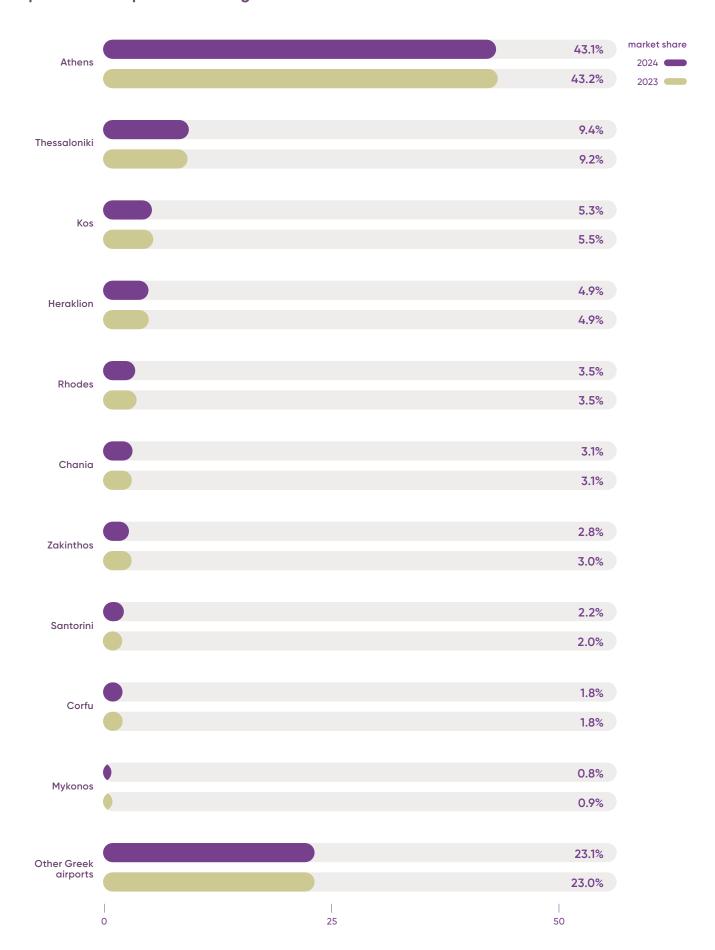
**Top 10 Greek Airports According to International Charter Passengers** 



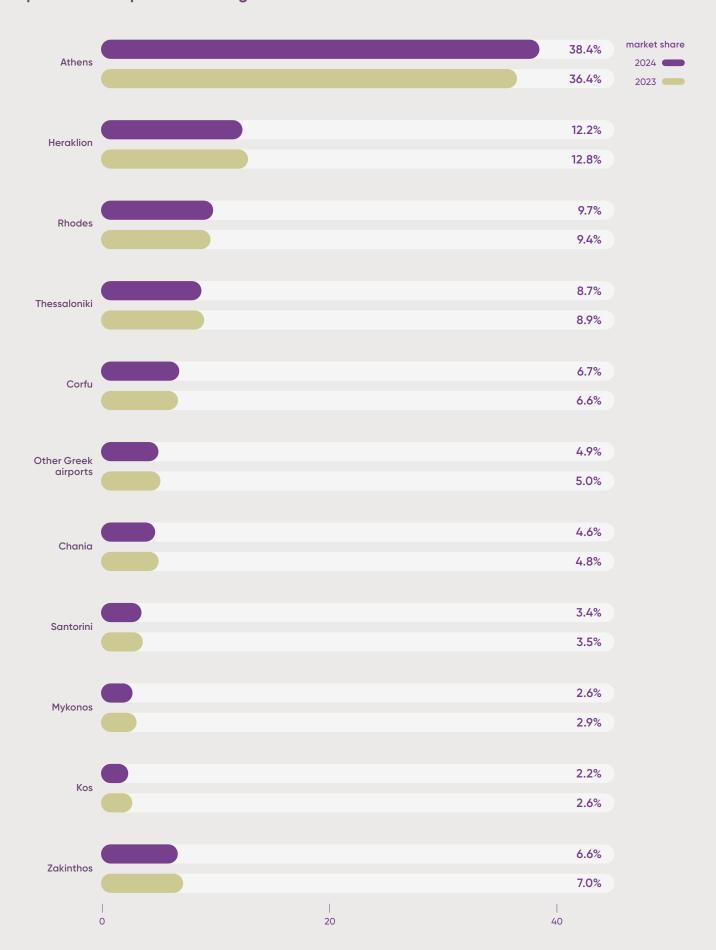
**Top 10 Greek Airports According to Total Aircraft Movements** 



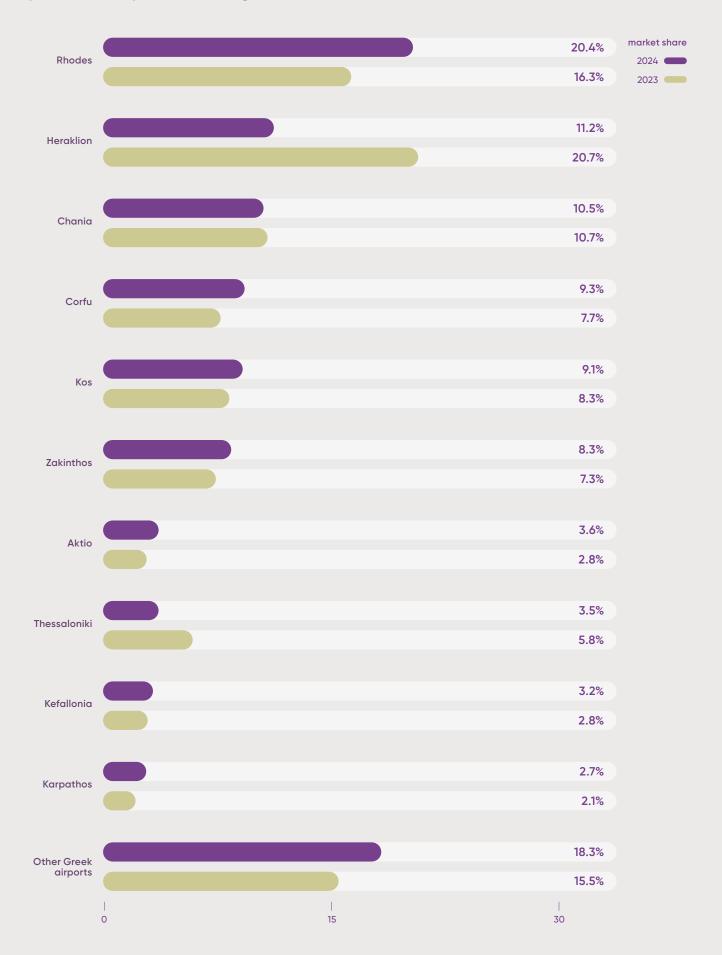
**Top 10 Greek Airports According to Domestic Aircraft Movements**

CHAPTER - 11

# Europe plus the world

In 2024, the global aviation industry experienced yet another year of recovery, with worldwide air passenger traffic surpassing 2023 figures by 8.3%, fully recovering from the Covid-19 crisis

In 2024, the global aviation industry marked another pivotal year of recovery, with worldwide air passenger traffic surpassing 2023 levels by 8.3%, fully rebounding from the impacts of the COVID-19 crisis. For the first time, global air travel demand exceeded pre-pandemic 2019 levels.

Despite this positive development, the industry continued to face significant macroeconomic and operational challenges, including rising fuel prices, ongoing geopolitical tensions—notably in Ukraine and the Middle East—labour shortages, and supply chain disruptions. According to Airports Council International (ACI), global passenger traffic outperformed initial 2024 projections, confirming robust travel demand in the face of adversity.

The Asia/Pacific region led the global recovery, posting the highest growth in passenger traffic with a 14.1% increase over 2023. Africa also demonstrated strong momentum, growing by 9.4%, while Europe recorded a 7.9% rise, signifying a solid bounce-back. The Middle East posted a 7.8% increase, while North America experienced more moderate growth at 4.5%. Latin America and the Caribbean recorded the smallest gain, with a 4.0% increase. In terms of aircraft movements, Asia/Pacific again led with a 7.8% increase, followed by Africa at 6.3%, and the Middle East with 5.6%. Europe and North America recorded more modest gains of 4.1% and 3.0%, respectively. Latin America and the Caribbean had the smallest growth in aircraft movements, at 1.1%. Globally, average growth in aircraft movements stood at 4.3%, indicating a consistent upward trend across all regions.

Among Europe's major airports, London Heathrow (LHR), Istanbul Airport (IST), and Paris Charles de Gaulle (CDG) retained the top three spots in passenger traffic rankings for 2024, with annual growth rates of 5.9%, 5.3%, and 4.3%, respectively.

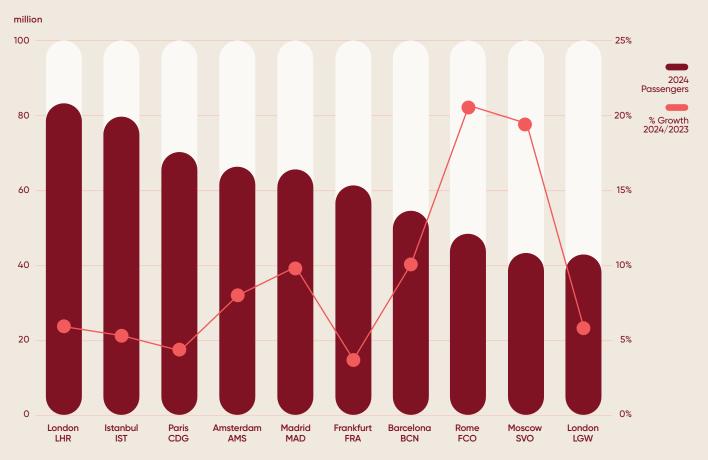
In comparison, Athens International Airport demonstrated exceptional performance, outpacing many of its European peers in the 25 million+ passengers category. AIA recorded a 13.1% increase in passenger traffic and an 11.9% in aircraft movements, underscoring its strong recovery and growing position in the European aviation landscape.

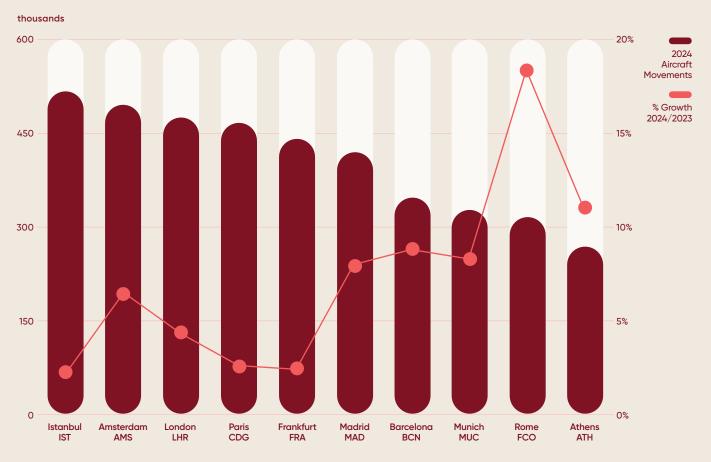

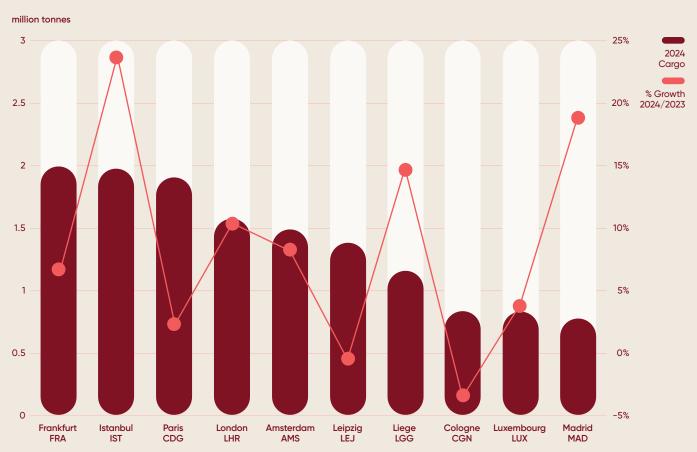
Top 10 European Airports According to Passenger Traffic



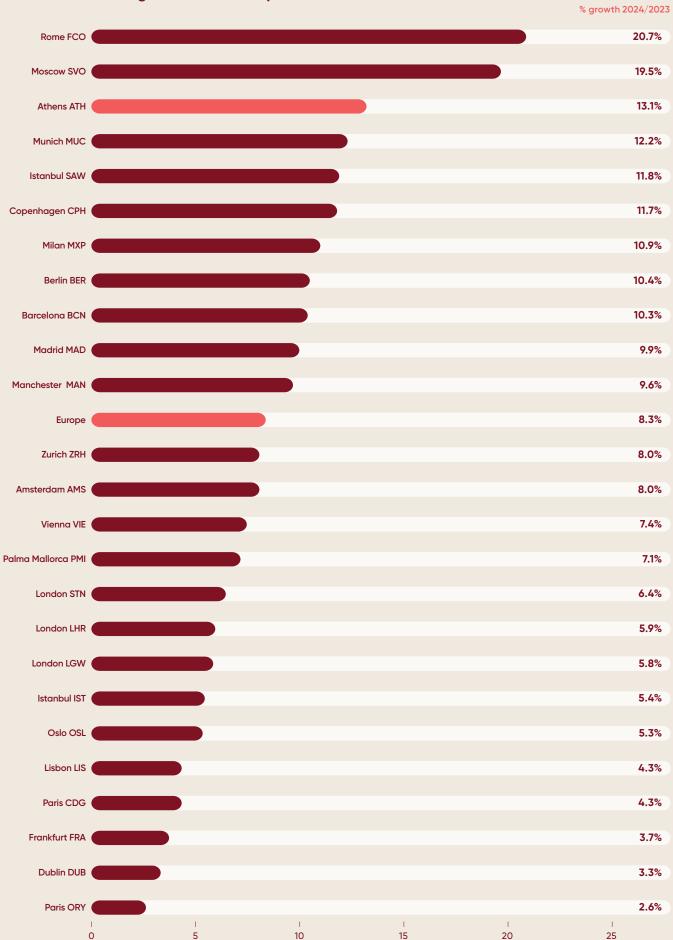
**Top 10 European Airports According to Aircraft Movements** 



Top 10 European Airports According to Cargo Uplift

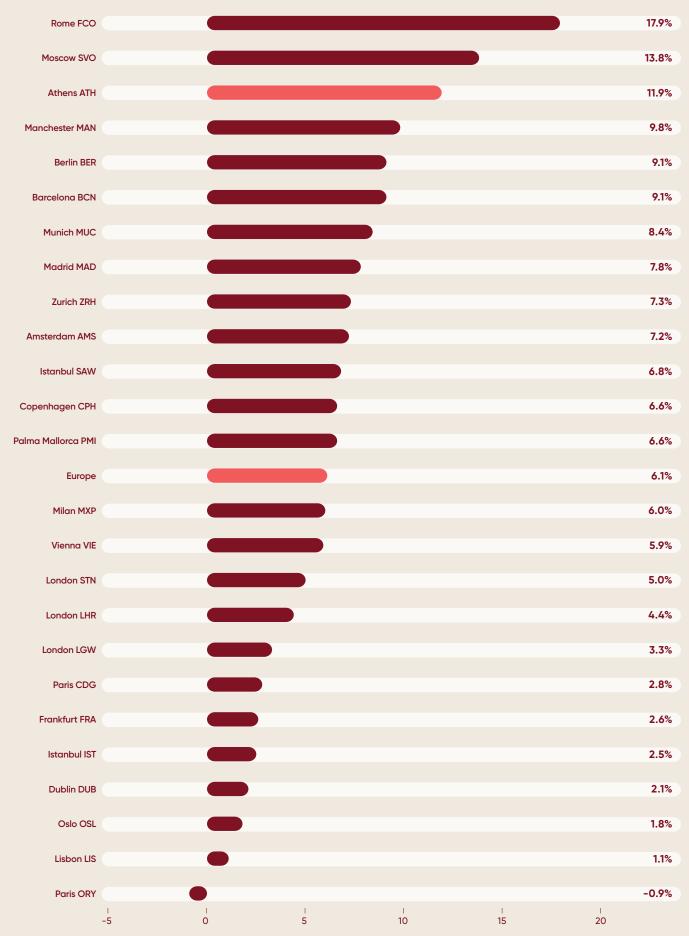


# Major European Airports (>25 Million Passengers In 2023) Commercial Passenger Traffic Development 2024

# Air Vocabulary

#### **Passenger and Flight Statistics**

- The origin and destination of a flight are defined according to the flight's first origin/last destination.
- A passenger's origin/destination is defined according to their point of embarkation/ disembarkation.
- Classification into Intra/Extra-Schengen for passengers and flights is designated according to the flight's last origin/first stop.
- Geographical regions are defined per the ACI classification.
- Transit Passengers are defined as passengers arriving at and departing from the Airport on the same flight number, without leaving the Airport's transit area (direct transit).
- · Terminal Passengers are all arriving and departing passengers, excluding transit passengers.
- · All statistical traffic data are measured in UTC and Land/Airborne times.
- Traffic data for the Greek peripheral airports are based on preliminary traffic results per the
  Hellenic Civil Aviation Authority (HCAA). The total number of Greece's domestic flights and
  passengers is double-counted (included in both the airport of origin and the destination airport).
- Traffic statistics for worldwide and European airports are per ACI World preliminary traffic results, using data from more than 1,000 airports around the globe.

#### **Cargo Traffic Statistics**

- The global outlook is based on statistics and analysis issued by the International Air Transport Association (IATA).
- AlA cargo statistics are based on submissions from cargo handlers (cargo manifest data actual
  weight) and include inbound and outbound freight and mail traffic handled (physical or document
  handling) through the Airport's cargo terminals. Freight refers to shipments transported under an
  Air Waybill and includes express/courier freight. Mail refers to shipments from Hellenic Post (ELTA)
  and/or other countries' postal authorities. Cargo refers to the sum of freight and mail.
- Volumes transported by road freight to and/or from AIA (trucked cargo) are not included in the
  official statistics (flown cargo) as per ACI guidelines.
- Transfer freight is defined as freight transported via Athens to another destination in Greece or abroad by air, by road, or by a combination of both. These volumes are included both in inbound and outbound traffic, but are also reported separately.
- Transit cargo is defined as cargo that remains onboard the aircraft for onward transportation to the flight's final destination and is not reported.
- Freighters' (cargo aircraft) uplift is included in total cargo volumes.
- The term 'Integrators' refers to the three main courier companies operating their own aircraft: DHL Express, FedEx Express and UPS.
- The top 10 origin and destination airports for cargo from/to AIA reflect the origin / destination of the shipments according to the Air Waybill (AWB), and are based on IATA's Cargo IS.

#### **Exercises on Punctuality**

- A flight is characterised as Delayed if it departs/arrives (off-/on-blocks) 16 or more minutes after its scheduled time .
- The Average Delay is calculated in minutes, considering only delayed flights.
- Delay reasons are classified according to IATA Delay Codes, as reported by airlines and/or handling agents. Statistics in this report should be interpreted with caution, given the limited number of delayed flights for which a delay reason has been declared.

#### Joining the Passenger Dots - Adding Tourists

- Passenger profile and tourism development data derive from the "Passengers' Survey" conducted by Athens International Airport since 2001, aiming to study Athens passengers' demographics and travel profiles and track changes over the years. The survey's annual sample consists of 40,000 interviews with departing passengers, conducted daily at the Airport's departure gates.
- Passenger volumes presented in the "Adding Tourists" chapter correspond to passenger arrivals for foreign residents and passenger departures for Greek residents.

#### **Our Grade Report**

- · Service Performance relates to:
  - Capturing passengers' and visitors' perceptions of service levels (passenger comment management process and Quality Monitor Survey);
  - Measuring actual performance in critical areas (service performance indicators).
- Service Performance indices reflect areas of service and facilities affecting a passenger's perception of the service level within the Airport premises.
- Thus, quantifiable indices have been established and monitored for several services offered
  either by the Airport Company or by a third party (airlines/handlers), in line with AIA's customer
  experience culture. These indices allow for accurate monitoring, benchmarking and the
  identification of initiatives to improve performance. Evaluating passenger-oriented services
  rendered by AIA or third parties is made possible through productive cooperation between the
  Company's departments.

#### **Check-in and Security Queues**

• Queuing time refers to the time elapsed from the moment a passenger joins the line until reaching the service point. Measurements are taken seven days a week between 06:00 and 22:00 hours.

#### **Baggage Reclaim**

Measuring the time between aircraft on-blocks and the first bag delivery (Obl-Fb), and the time
from first bag to last bag delivery (Fb-Lb) is the standard method used internationally to assess
baggage reclaim performance and approximate the level of service provided.

#### Info Desk

 Although the info-desk queries index does not directly measure service performance, it does connote the effect of passenger traffic on information counters.

#### **Call Centre**

AlA's call centre statistics are produced by the Report Manager, who provides historical statistical
reporting and information on all contact centre activities. These statistics can be retrieved at
tensecond intervals. Service level refers to the percentage of incoming service calls answered
within a specified time - set at 20 seconds between the end of the introductory message and the
agent's response.

#### **Passenger Comments**

• In compliance with Article 10 of the ACI-Europe Airport Voluntary Commitment, Athens International Airport has established an integrated Passenger Complaint Management System.

#### i-mind

- · The "i-mind" programme of Athens International Airport, was relaunced in February 2024.
- This innovative initiative places all AIA employees in the position of a "virtual passenger", encouraging them to observe, care for, and comment on the Airport Environment, regardless of operational expertise. Seeking common-sense improvements for the Airport's infrastructure and services, the power of "i-mind" lies in participation, involvement, personal care and the special relationship employees have with their workplace.
- Alert is a condition where immediate actions are required and responsible departments are notified.

#### **Airport Service Evaluation**

Airport Services Evaluation is derived from the Quality Monitor Survey (QMS), conducted by AIA
since 2001 to measure the quality of facilities and services offered at the Airport and maintain high
levels of customer service. The annual survey sample consists of 7,000 interviews with departing
and arriving passengers conducted daily at departure gates and the arrival hall.
